5th Sunday of Lent: Come Forth

“And when he had said this, He cried out in a loud voice, ‘Lazarus, come out!’ The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth.”(Jn 11:43-44)

WORD OF LIFE

This Sunday, so close to Holy Week, the Gospel invites us to meditate on the resurrection of Lazarus. This passage of the Gospel shows us the great humanity of Jesus and His pain at the loss of a friend. It also shows that He put Himself in grave danger to help His friend. He knew that they were looking for Him to kill Him and that going to Lazarus' house meant He would be in close proximity to His enemies.

When we notice that there is someone who cares about us and truly loves us, we should be filled with great joy.

Moreover, we must become aware that the miracle of the resurrection of Lazarus occurs only because there is faith. This is what will happen to us. We will be saved but only if we have faith in Jesus, if we are by His side and if we believe in His grace. Today's Gospel teaches us that miracles may happen through a "borrowed faith" (our deeds cannot be transferred, but our faith can). Christ did not ask Lazarus to have faith, for he was already dead, but He did ask Martha, his sister. We may also ask the Lord to work miracles in others, even if they do not have faith. Furthermore, this faith should be transformed into gratitude, as without doubt Martha, Mary, and Lazarus himself had. Otherwise, it would not be true faith.

Lastly, Christ invites us to get out of our tomb of sin, through a resurrection that is within our reach every day: confession. He also encourages us to give testimony that it is Christ who has freed and saved us.

Purpose: Go out of your tomb, get out of your sin. If you have not gone to confession yet, go this week. Become a witness of God's triumph through your good deeds.

V Domingo de Cuaresma: Salir fuera

“Y dicho esto, gritó con voz potente: ‘Lázaro, ven afuera’. El muerto salió, los pies y las manos atados con vendas, y la cara envuelta en un sudario” (Jn 11, 43-44)

PALABRA DE VIDA

Este domingo, tan próximo ya a la Semana Santa, el Evangelio nos invita a meditar acerca de la resurrección de Lázaro. Este pasaje del Evangelio nos muestra, como pocos, la gran humanidad de Jesús, su dolor ante la muerte de un amigo y también el hecho de que acudiera a ayudarlo poniéndose en peligro, pues sabía que le buscaban para matarle y que ir a casa de Lázaro era acercarse demasiado a sus enemigos.

Esta constatación nos debe llenar de alegría, al sabernos objeto del interés de alguien que de verdad nos ama. Además, debemos darnos cuenta de que el milagro de la resurrección de Lázaro sólo ocurre porque hay fe y eso mismo será lo que ocurrirá con nosotros: sólo nos salvaremos, sólo nos convertiremos, si tenemos fe en Jesús, si estamos a su lado, si creemos en su fuerza. En tercer lugar, este Evangelio nos enseña que el milagro se puede producir con una "fe prestada"; las obras no se pueden traspasar, pero sí la fe. Lázaro estaba muerto y Cristo no le pidió a él que tuviera fe, sino a su hermana. También nosotros podemos pedirle al Señor que haga milagros en los demás, aunque ellos no tengan fe en esos milagros. Además, esa fe tiene que traducirse en gratitud, como sin duda tuvieron Marta, María y el propio Lázaro, pues de lo contrario no es verdadera fe.

Por último, Cristo nos invita a salir fuera de nuestra tumba, del pecado, mediante una resurrección que está a nuestro alcance cada día: la confesión. Y a dar testimonio de que es Cristo quien nos ha liberado, quien nos ha salvado.

Propósito: Sal fuera de tu tumba, del pecado. Si aún no te has confesado en la Cuaresma, hazlo esta semana. Y sé testigo del triunfo de Dios mediante las buenas obras.

Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion.

Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say **Amen**. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

Directrices para Recibir la Eucaristía

No debes comer ni beber nada excepto agua o medicinas necesarias durante una hora antes de recibir la comunión. Esto se llama ayuno de la Comunión o Eucaristía. Esto es para ayudarnos a centrarnos en nuestro Señor y en lo que estamos a punto de recibir. Por tanto, masticar chicle, caramelos, mentas, etc. durante la misa es inapropiado. Ambas formas de recibir la hostia son aceptables, en la palma de una mano con la otra mano debajo, o en la lengua extendida.

Extiende las manos con las palmas hacia arriba hacia el sacerdote y quédate lo más cerca posible del sacerdote al recibir la Comunión. Nunca le quites la hostia al sacerdote. Después de recibir la Eucaristía, dices **Amén**. La reverencia y el respeto adecuados son lo más importante; las manos deben estar cruzadas con reverencia mientras esperan recibir el Sacramento.

Children's Religious Education ~Faith Formation~

Saint Stephen provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available 1st – 8th grade and they meet Sundays at 9a Sept. to May.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. **Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date.** One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage **MUST** meet with the priest before setting a date.

Anointing of the Sick

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick during the First Friday's Mass at 12p. If needed at another time, please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.

Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. An active member is one who is properly registered with the Parish office, regularly gives offertory, attends parish activities when possible and most importantly faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.
