*“From noon onward, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And about three o'clock Jesus cried out in a loud voice, ‘Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?’ which means, ‘My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?’”  
(Mt 27:45-46)*

### **WORD OF LIFE**

With Palm Sunday, we enter into Holy Week. And so, we will consider all the events that we celebrate during these seven days and focus on what they teach us and how we should behave in light of these events. In fact, today's account of the Lord's Passion gives us the opportunity to see the drama of the Passion of the Lord in its entirety.

Particularly, the Lord's death demands our attention. Christ is on the Cross and, although innocent, is dying amidst tortures. He has voluntarily accepted His destiny, not because He likes to suffer, but because He has a mission to fulfill and He knows that, in order to do so, He has to cross the threshold of suffering by accepting His Cross. His mission is that of saving us, and He carries it out not only by shedding His redeeming blood for the forgiveness of our sins, but also by becoming one with us and sharing our fate, including physical pain, abandonment, and injustice.

Christ's goal is achieved when we feel challenged by His love and His Cross. If His love moves us, if His love converts us, then His sacrifice will have been worth it. If we remain impassible, we will have made His death senseless. Let's allow our-selves to be drawn close to and saved by Christ.

Let God be God and save you.

**Purpose: Meditate on the love of Christ manifested on the Cross. Become aware of what He has done for you. Give Him thanks and draw close to Him so that His sacrifice may not be in vain.**

### **PALABRA DE VIDA**

El domingo de Ramos abre la puerta a la Semana Santa. Por lo tanto, deberemos tener presente todos los acontecimientos que se celebran en esos siete días para fijarnos en lo que nos enseñan y en cómo hemos de comportarnos a su luz. De hecho, la lectura de la pasión que se hace en este día nos da la oportunidad de ver de una sola vez el drama íntegro de la Pasión.

La muerte del Señor, especialmente, se convierte en un reclamo para nuestra atención. Cristo está en la Cruz, muriendo en medio de la tortura, siendo inocente. Ha aceptado voluntariamente ocupar ese lugar y lo ha hecho no por que le guste el dolor, sino porque tiene que cumplir una misión y sabe que, para ello, debe cruzar esa puerta, la puerta del sufrimiento, la puerta de la cruz. Su misión es la salvación, pero la lleva a cabo no sólo derramando su sangre redentora para perdonarnos los pecados, sino también haciéndose uno con nosotros, compartiendo con nosotros nuestra suerte, incluido el sufrimiento físico, el abandono, la injusticia.

El objetivo de Cristo se logra plenamente cuando nosotros nos sentimos interpelados por él, por su amor, por su cruz. Si su amor nos conmueve, nos convierte, entonces su sacrificio ha servido para algo. Si permanecemos impassibles ante él, le habremos hecho inútil o al menos no plenamente útil. Dejémonos seducir por Cristo, dejémonos atraer por él, dejémonos salvar. Déjale a Dios que haga de Dios y que te salve.

**Propósito: Medita sobre el amor de Cristo manifestado en la cruz. Date cuenta de lo que él ha hecho por ti. Agradéceselo y acércate a Él para que su sacrificio no sea en vano.**

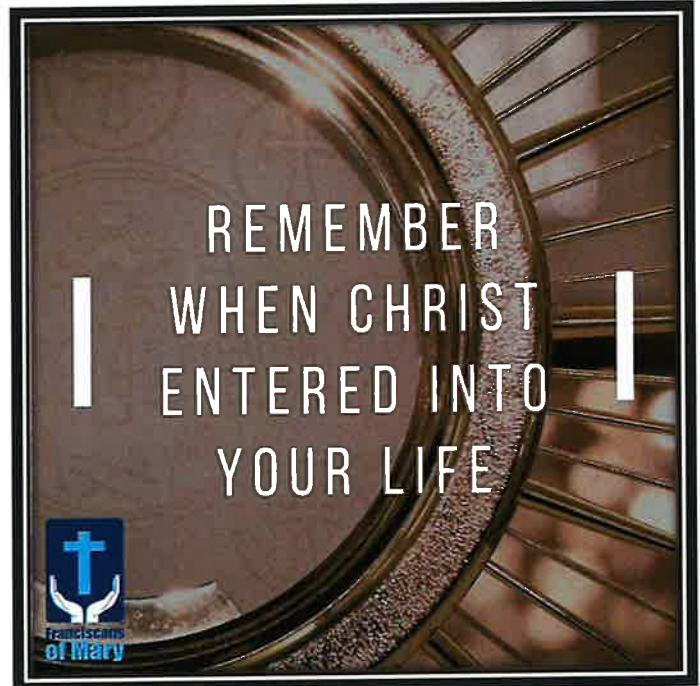

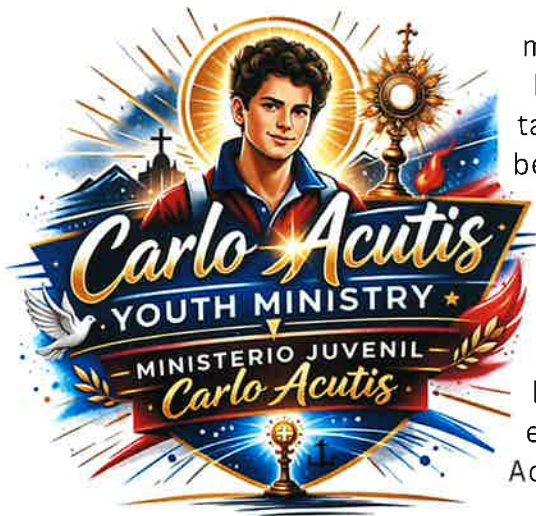

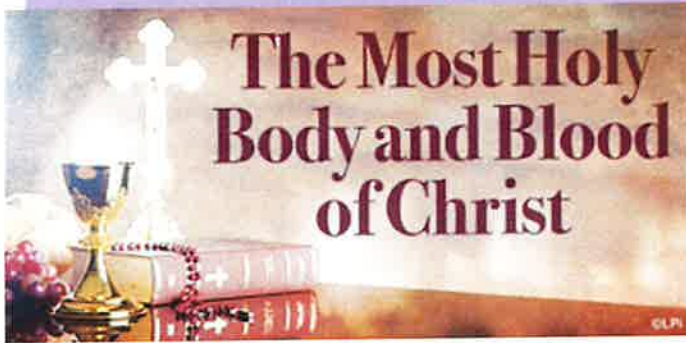

### **Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist**

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion.

Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say **Amen**. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

### **Directrices para Recibir la Eucaristía**

No debes comer ni beber nada excepto agua o medicinas necesarias durante una hora antes de recibir la comunión. Esto se llama ayuno de la Comunión o Eucaristía. Esto es para ayudarnos a centrarnos en nuestro Señor y en lo que estamos a punto de recibir. Por tanto, masticar chicle, caramelos, mentas, etc. durante la misa es inapropiado. Ambas formas de recibir la hostia son aceptables, en la palma de una mano con la otra mano debajo, o en la lengua extendida.

Extiende las manos con las palmas hacia arriba hacia el sacerdote y quédate lo más cerca posible del sacerdote al recibir la Comunión. Nunca le quites la hostia al sacerdote. Después de recibir la Eucaristía, dices Amén. La reverencia y el respeto adecuados son lo más importante; las manos deben estar cruzadas con reverencia mientras esperan recibir el Sacramento.

### **OCIA Classes Wednesday Evenings: 7-8:30p in Social Hall**

For Catholics and non-Catholics who wish to gain knowledge and information about the Catholic faith. The classes are also for those Catholic adults and high schoolers that have not completed their sacraments. The classes begin in September and will be completed by Easter. For additional information please call the office.

### **Children's Religious Education ~Faith Formation~**

Saint Stephen provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available 1<sup>st</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade and they meet Sundays at 9a Sept. to May.

### **Baptism**

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. **Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date.** One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

### **Matrimony**

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage **MUST** meet with the priest before setting a date.

### **Anointing of the Sick**

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick during the First Friday's Mass at 12p. If needed at another time, please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.

### **Active Parishioner Status**

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. An active member is one who is properly registered with the Parish office, regularly gives offertory, attends parish activities when possible and most importantly faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.
