

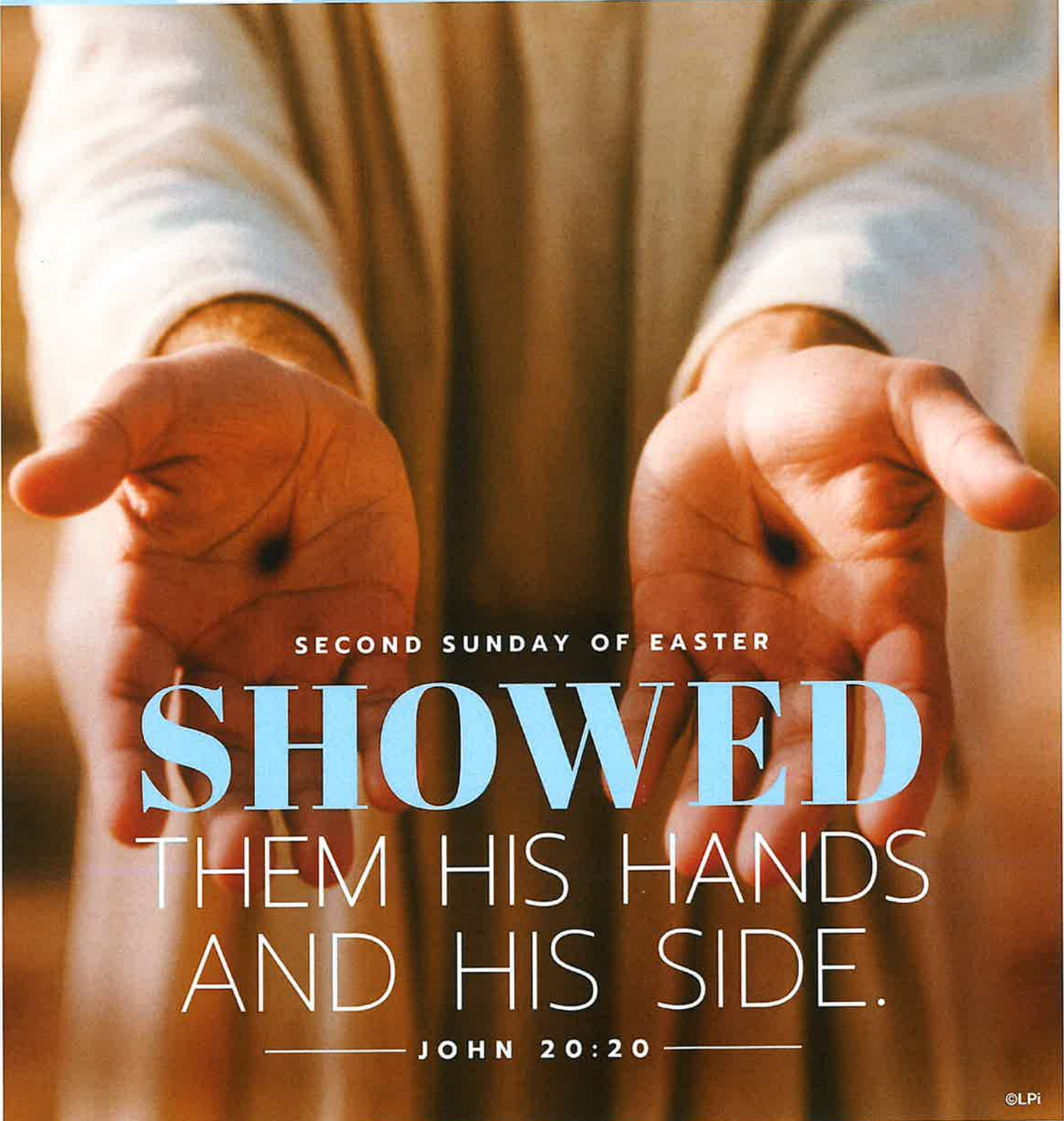

## 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter: Become the Living Body of Christ

*“Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.” (Jn 20:25)*

## II Domingo de Pascua: Ser el cuerpo vivo de Cristo

*Si no veo en sus manos la señal de los clavos, si no meto el dedo en el agujero de los clavos y no meto la mano en su costado, no lo creo” (Jn 20, 25)*

### WORD OF LIFE

The evangelical account of this week invites us to meditate on the apparition of the Risen Christ to the apostles when Thomas was absent, and the later apparition of the Lord in his presence. Thomas' request, who demands “tangible” proofs in order to believe in the Resurrection of Christ, is the petition of many people, who renounce accepting anything that cannot be demonstrated by reason or through the senses. By doing so, they close the gates of faith for themselves.

Let's try to live this “Word of Life” by becoming a type of “living body of Christ,” a Risen Christ who is able to say to the unbeliever: Come and touch, put your fin-ger into the holes that the nails made in my hands.

These nail marks are not only symbolic but, at times, also have physical footprints produced by the wear and tear that loving our neighbor implies, or equally, by putting the weight of others on our shoulders to give them relief. When someone asks us why we are doing that, then will be the time to give this answer: because Christ is alive, because He bore our problems and we have a debt to pay, and we can do so by helping those who are overwhelmed so that they may live a little better.

Therefore, be aware that people are observing us. If we behave as good Christians, we will become the body of the Risen Christ that convinces the unbeliever that the Lord is alive. It is the wounds of Christ that attract those who want proof in order to believe in the love of God.

**Purpose: Become a witness to the victory of love over egotism. Become a witness to attract and convince others by your behavior. May they be touched by your love and believe.**

### PALABRA DE VIDA

El relato evangélico de esta semana nos invita a meditar sobre la aparición de Cristo resucitado a los apóstoles en ausencia de Tomás y la posterior aparición del Señor en presencia de éste. La petición de Tomás, que reclama pruebas “palpables” para creer en la resurrección de Cristo, es la petición de muchos hombres, que se niegan a aceptar todo aquello que no puede ser demostrado por la razón o comprobado por los sentidos y que, al hacerlo, se cierran a sí mismos las puertas de la fe.

La "palabra de vida" la viviremos intentando ser una especie de "cuerpo vivo de Cristo", un Cristo resucitado que puede decir a los incrédulos de hoy: ven y toca, mete tus dedos en los agujeros que han dejado en mis manos los clavos.

Esos agujeros no serán sólo simbólicos, sino que a veces tendrán también huellas físicas, producidas por el desgaste que lleva consigo amar al prójimo, o lo que es lo mismo, echar sobre nuestros hombros pesos que no son nuestros pero que alivian a los demás. Cuando alguien pregunte por qué lo hacemos, será el momento de contestar: porque Cristo está vivo, porque Él ha cargado con mis problemas y yo tengo una deuda que pagarle y la pago así: complicándome la vida por los que están agobiados para que ellos puedan vivir un poco mejor.

Por lo tanto, date cuenta de que te observan. Si te comportas como un buen cristiano, serás el cuerpo resucitado de Cristo que convence a los incrédulos de que el Señor está vivo. Son las heridas de la caridad las que atraen a los que quieren pruebas para creer en el amor de Dio.

**Propósito: Ser testigo de la victoria del amor sobre el egoísmo. Ser testigo con mi comportamiento, para atraer a los demás, para convencerles. Que toquen mi amor y crean.**

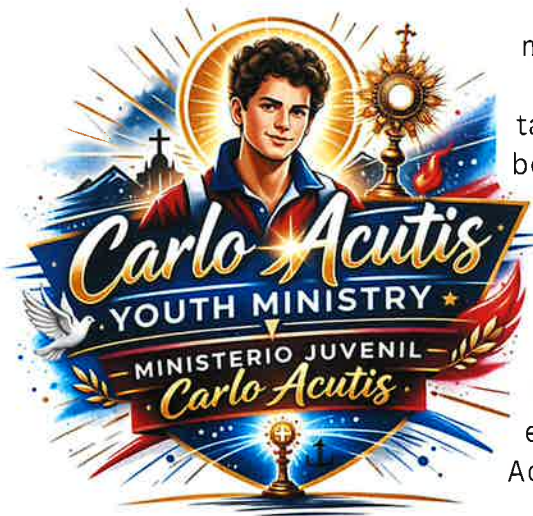

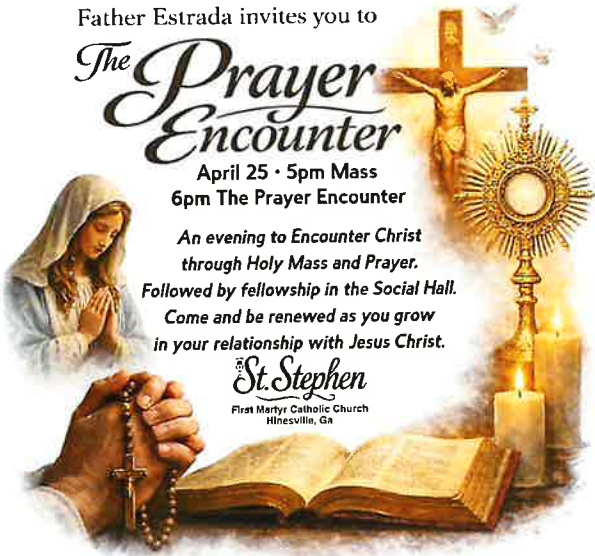

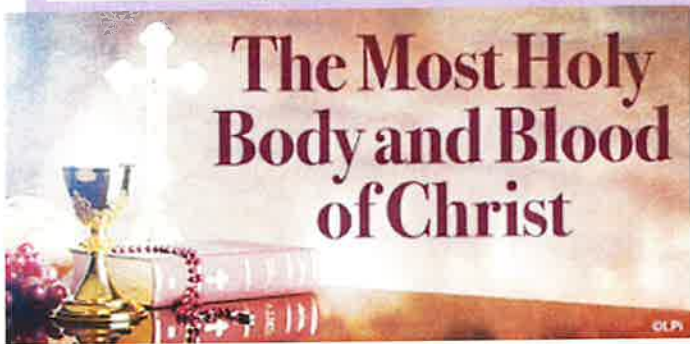

**Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist**

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion.

Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say **Amen**. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

**Directrices para Recibir la Eucaristía**

No debes comer ni beber nada excepto agua o medicinas necesarias durante una hora antes de recibir la comunión. Esto se llama ayuno de la Comunión o Eucaristía. Esto es para ayudarnos a centrarnos en nuestro Señor y en lo que estamos a punto de recibir. Por tanto, masticar chicle, caramelos, mentas, etc. durante la misa es inapropiado. Ambas formas de recibir la hostia son aceptables, en la palma de una mano con la otra mano debajo, o en la lengua extendida.

Extiende las manos con las palmas hacia arriba hacia el sacerdote y quédate lo más cerca posible del sacerdote al recibir la Comunión. Nunca le quites la hostia al sacerdote. Después de recibir la Eucaristía, dices **Amén**. La reverencia y el respeto adecuados son lo más importante; las manos deben estar cruzadas con reverencia mientras esperan recibir el Sacramento.

### **OCIA Classes Wednesday Evenings: 7-8:30p in Social Hall**

For Catholics and non-Catholics who wish to gain knowledge and information about the Catholic faith. The classes are also for those Catholic adults and high schoolers that have not completed their sacraments. The classes begin in September and will be completed by Easter. For additional information please call the office.

### **Children's Religious Education ~Faith Formation~**

Saint Stephen provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available 1<sup>st</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade and they meet Sundays at 9a Sept. to May.

### **Baptism**

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. **Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date.** One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

### **Matrimony**

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage **MUST** meet with the priest before setting a date.

### **Anointing of the Sick**

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick during the First Friday's Mass at 12p. If needed at another time, please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.

### **Active Parishioner Status**

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. An active member is one who is properly registered with the Parish office, regularly gives offertory, attends parish activities when possible and most importantly faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.
