The Ascension of the Lord: Adulthood

“Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.” (Mt 28:19-20)

WORD OF LIFE

Without a doubt, the Ascension of the Lord into Heaven caused an enormous sorrow for the apostles. It is true that this sorrow was mitigated by the different “presences” of

Christ on earth—the Eucharist, the Word, the apostles themselves, the neighbor in need, and His presence in the midst of His disciples—as well as by the motherly assistance of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the hope of meeting Him again in Heaven.

But, in addition to this sorrow, the absence of Christ signified a void that the apostles and disciples had to fill. It is like when a great personage, who has been everything in the lives of many in the business or family, passes away. With his loss, it seems that everything will fall apart, because no one can fill the void which that prominent person left behind. As a result, if those around him think like this, crisis and ruin will inevitably ensue. If, on the other hand, aware of their own unimportance but not getting discouraged by it, they try to imitate that great personage, they might not attain the heights he reached, but life will go on. Moreover, this struggle will make them grow, just as little trees grow when the bigger one, that was giving them shade, disappears.

Christ is in Heaven, and we are on Earth. We must fight for Him and His Kingdom with the help of the Holy Spirit, the Blessed Mother, the saints, and the nourishment of the Eucharist. It is the hour of our adulthood. It is time to demonstrate to the Lord that He can count on us, that we have internalized His teachings, and that we are resolved to bring about the work of evangelization that He has entrusted to us.

Purpose: When you do not know what to do in the face of a problem, ask yourself what Jesus would do. How would Christ have solved it? Then, ask Him for His help and act upon it.

La Ascensión del Señor: La mayoría de edad

“Id y haced discípulos de todos los pueblos... enseñándoles a guardar todo lo que os he mandado” (Mt 28, 19)

PALABRA DE VIDA

La Ascensión del Señor al cielo supuso, sin duda, un enorme pesar para los apóstoles. Ciertamente que el dolor de la separación quedaba mitigado por las “presencias” de Cristo en la tierra - la Eucaristía, la Palabra, los Apóstoles, el prójimo necesitado, su presencia en medio de los discípulos-, así como por la asistencia maternal de la Virgen y por la esperanza en volverse a encontrar con él en la vida eterna.

Pero, además del dolor, la ausencia de Cristo representaba un vacío que ahora eran ellos, los apóstoles, los discípulos, los que habían de llenar. Es como cuando muere una de esas grandes personalidades que lo han sido todo en la vida de muchos, en la empresa o en la familia; da la impresión de que, con su partida, todo se vendrá abajo, pues parece inimaginable que se pueda llenar el hueco que ha dejado tan importante personaje. Si los que le rodean piensan así, inevitablemente se producirá la crisis y la ruina. Si, en cambio, conscientes de su pequeñez pero sin acobardarse por ella, intentan imitar al gran personaje, quizá no logren las cotas que él alcanzó, pero todo irá adelante. Además, esta lucha les hará crecer, lo mismo que crecen los árboles pequeños cuando el gran árbol que les daba sombra desaparece.

Cristo está en el cielo y nosotros en la tierra. Debemos luchar por Él y por su Reino. Con la ayuda del Espíritu Santo, de la Virgen, de los santos. Con el alimento de la Eucaristía. Es la hora de nuestra mayoría de edad. Es la hora de demostrarle al Señor que puede contar con nosotros, que hemos asimilado sus enseñanzas, que -con la ayuda de su gracia, sin la cual no podemos hacer nada- estamos dispuestos a llevar a cabo la tarea evangelizadora que nos confió.

Propósito: Cuando no sepas qué hacer ante un problema, pregúntate qué haría Cristo, cómo lo habría resuelto Cristo. Luego pídele ayuda a Él y ponte a hacerlo.

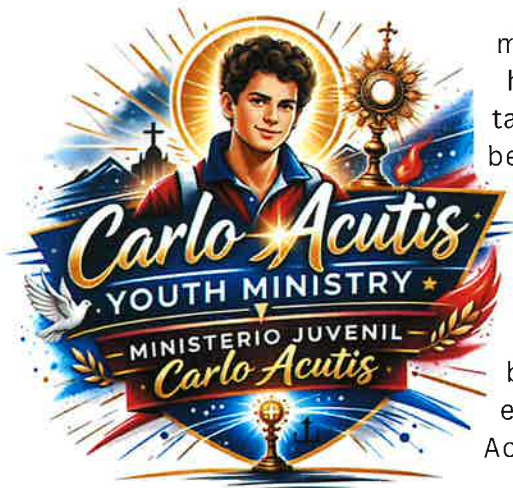

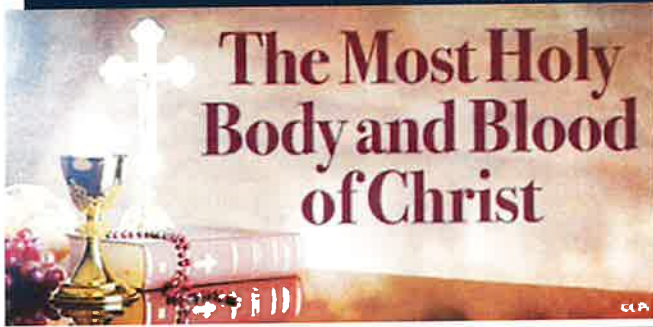

Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion.

Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say **Amen**. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

Directrices para Recibir la Eucaristía

No debes comer ni beber nada excepto agua o medicinas necesarias durante una hora antes de recibir la comunión. Esto se llama ayuno de la Comunión o Eucaristía. Esto es para ayudarnos a centrarnos en nuestro Señor y en lo que estamos a punto de recibir. Por tanto, masticar chicle, caramelos, mentas, etc. durante la misa es inapropiado. Ambas formas de recibir la hostia son aceptables, en la palma de una mano con la otra mano debajo, o en la lengua extendida. Extiende las manos con las palmas hacia arriba hacia el sacerdote y quédate lo más cerca posible del sacerdote al recibir la Comunión. Nunca le quites la hostia al sacerdote. Después de recibir la Eucaristía, dices Amén. La reverencia y el respeto adecuados son lo más importante; las manos deben estar cruzadas con reverencia mientras esperan recibir el Sacramento.

Children's Religious Education ~Faith Formation~

Saint Stephen provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available 1st – 8th grade and they meet Sundays at 9a Sept. to May.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. **Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date.** One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage **MUST** meet with the priest before setting a date.

Anointing of the Sick

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick during the First Friday's Mass at 5:30p. If needed at another time, please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.

Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. An active member is one who is properly registered with the Parish office, regularly gives offertory, attends parish activities when possible and most importantly faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.
