## **Pentecost Sunday: Peace Be with You**

*“Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, ‘Peace be with you.’ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord.” (Jn 20:20)*

---

### WORD OF LIFE

The Holy Spirit is a gift from the Risen Lord, an extraordinary gift that is accompanied by other gifts. One of these gifts is peace. Another is joy. However, neither the peace nor the joy that accompany the Holy Spirit have to do with what men of-ten seek. To many people, peace is a result of war and joy is linked to money and consumption. For us Christians, peace comes from love and justice, while joy is born of generosity. Peace also stems from reconciliation and forgiveness: a forgiveness that one gives; a forgiveness that one receives in confession from God, the One offended; and a forgiveness that opens the doors of holiness for us.

Therefore, these are the four keys of Pentecost: peace, joy, forgiveness and holiness. We must ask the Holy Spirit for these gifts and work so that, once they have been granted to us, they take root in us and bear abundant fruit. What can we do to bring peace? Do we have the joy that those who love have? Have we forgiven or asked for forgiveness? Do we strive for holiness? These are the four questions we have to answer for this week.

**Purpose: Work for peace by doing what is good, by avoiding or eliminating tensions, by forgiving and asking for forgiveness, and by helping those in need. Go to confession.**

## **Pentecostés: Paz a vosotros**

*“En esto entró Jesús, se puso en medio y les dijo: ¡Paz a vosotros Y diciendo esto les enseñó las manos y el costado. Y los discípulo se llenaron de alegría” (Jn 20, 20)*

### PALABRA DE VIDA

El Espíritu Santo es un don del Señor resucitado. Un don extraordinario que va acompañado de otros dones. Uno de ellos es el de la paz. Otro es el de la alegría. Sin embargo, ni la paz ni la alegría que acompañan al Espíritu, tienen que ver con las que a menudo buscan los hombres. Para muchos, la paz es fruto de la guerra y la alegría va unida al dinero y al gasto. Para los cristianos, la paz nace del amor y de la justicia, mientras que la alegría va unida a la generosidad. La paz nace también de otra cosa: la reconciliación, el perdón. Un perdón que se recibe –del ofendido, de Dios en la confesión- y que se da; un perdón que nos abre las puertas de la santidad.

Estas son, pues, las cuatro claves de Pentecostés: paz, alegría, perdón, santidad. Debemos pedirle al Espíritu Santo que nos regale esos dones y debemos trabajar para que, una vez otorgados, echen raíces en nosotros y fructifiquen abundantemente. ¿Qué puedo hacer yo por la paz? ¿Tengo esa alegría que poseen los que aman? ¿He perdonado o he pedido perdón? ¿Busco la santidad?. Son las cuatro preguntas que debemos responder esta semana.

**Propósito: Trabajar por la paz haciendo el bien, evitando o quitando tensiones, perdonando y pidiendo perdón, ayudando a quien lo necesita. Y confesarse.**

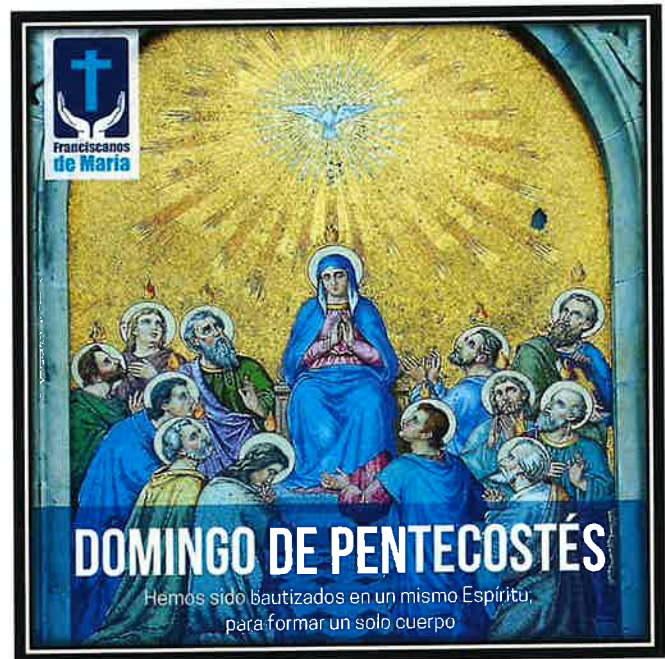



**Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist**

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion.

Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say **Amen**. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

**Directrices para Recibir la Eucaristía**

No debes comer ni beber nada excepto agua o medicinas necesarias durante una hora antes de recibir la comunión. Esto se llama ayuno de la Comunión o Eucaristía. Esto es para ayudarnos a centrarnos en nuestro Señor y en lo que estamos a punto de recibir. Por tanto, masticar chicle, caramelos, mentas, etc. durante la misa es inapropiado. Ambas formas de recibir la hostia son aceptables, en la palma de una mano con la otra mano debajo, o en la lengua extendida. Extiende las manos con las palmas hacia arriba hacia el sacerdote y quédate lo más cerca posible del sacerdote al recibir la Comunión. Nunca le quites la hostia al sacerdote. Después de recibir la Eucaristía, dices Amén. La reverencia y el respeto adecuados son lo más importante; las manos deben estar cruzadas con reverencia mientras esperan recibir el Sacramento.

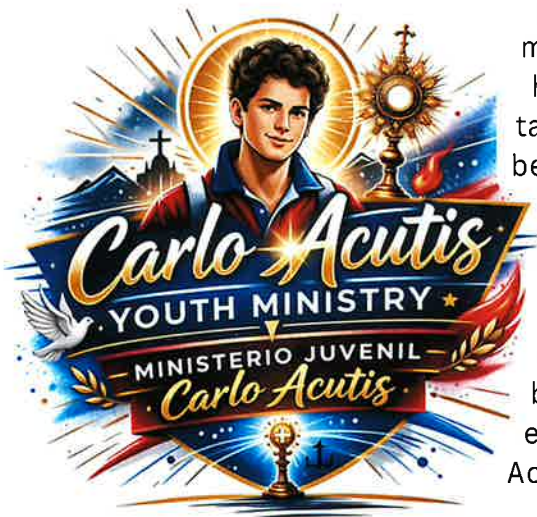

Saint Stephen provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available 1<sup>st</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grade and they meet Sundays at 9a Sept. to May.

### **Baptism**

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. **Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date.** One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

### **Matrimony**

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage **MUST** meet with the priest before setting a date.

### **Anointing of the Sick**

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick during the First Friday's Mass at 5:30p. If needed at another time, please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.

### **Active Parishioner Status**

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. An active member is one who is properly registered with the Parish office, regularly gives offertory, attends parish activities when possible and most importantly faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.
