WORD OF LIFE

13TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: GOD'S PLACE

"Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." (Mt 10:37-39)

If someone dared to tell a father that he has to love him more than he loves his own son, or if he dared to tell us that we must love him more than our own life, we would think that person is crazy or infinitely proud. No one can claim such a devotion for himself, no one except God. He indeed has the right to occupy the first place in our heart and in our life. He has this right because He is God. He is our Creator and our Savior.

This week, we will try to live out this part of the Gospel of Saint Matthew by making an examination of conscience to see where God really lies within our scale of values. What is first? Our job or God? What is first? Entertainment or God? To discover the answer, it is useful to look at how much time we spend on each. It's normal for us to dedicate more time to work than to prayer, but not so much that there is no time left for prayer. The same goes for relaxing. The value that we place on things and on people is measured by the time that we dedicate to them. The time that we devote to God indicates the importance that God has for us. And then the rest will follow suit, acting according to our conscience, even if that poses a problem for us. But let's not forget that by putting God first in our lives, which is the place that is due Him, does not mean that we forget about or disregard everything and everyone else. It simply means that, out of love for God, we will also love them, even when we do not feel like it.

Purpose: Devote some time for prayer every day. Analyze, as you do an examination of conscience, if there is any behavior of yours that is not proper for a Christian.

PALABRA DE VIDA

DOMINGO XIII DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO: EL LUGAR DE DIOS

"El que quiere a su padre o a su madre más que a mí, no es digno de mí; y el que quiere a su hijo o a su hija más que a mí, no es digno de mí; y el que no toma su cruz y me sigue, no es digno de mí. El que encuentre su vida, la perderá y el que pierda su vida por mí, la encontrará" (Mt 10, 37-39)

Si alguien se atreviera a decir a un padre que tiene que amarle más que ama a su hijo, o si se atreviera a decirnos a cualquiera que tenemos que amarle más que a nuestra propia vida, pensaríamos que está loco o que tiene una soberbia infinita. Nadie puede pedirnos semejante entrega. Nadie, excepto una persona: Dios. Él sí que tiene derecho a estar en el primer lugar de nuestro corazón, de nuestra vida, de nuestros intereses. Tiene ese derecho por ser Dios, por ser nuestro Creador, por ser nuestro Redentor.

Por eso, esta semana intentaremos vivir este fragmento del Evangelio de San Mateo haciendo un examen de conciencia para ver en qué lugar real está Dios dentro de nuestra escala de valores. ¿Es antes el trabajo o Dios? ¿Es antes la diversión o Dios?. Para ello será útil que nos fijemos en el tiempo que dedicamos a cada cosa. Es natural que dediquemos más tiempo a trabajar que a rezar, pero no tanto que no quede nada para lo segundo. Y lo mismo pasa con el descanso. El valor que damos a las cosas –y a las personas– se mide por el tiempo que pasamos con ellas. El tiempo que dedicamos a Dios nos da la medida de la importancia que para nosotros tiene Dios. Y después vendrá lo demás: actuar conforme a nuestra conciencia, aunque eso nos suponga algún problema. Pero, no lo olvidemos, poner a Dios en el primer lugar de la vida, que es el que le corresponde, no significa olvidar o despreciar al resto; significa que, por amor a Dios, vamos también a amarles a ellos, incluso cuando no nos apetezca.

Propósito: Dedicar todos los días un tiempo a la oración. Analizar, en el examen de conciencia, si hay algún comportamiento nuestro que no es propio de un cristiano.

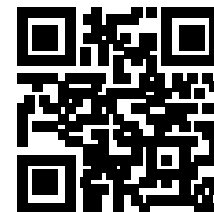

The Diocese of Savannah provides Safe Environment Training online at virtusonline.org available in English, Spanish, Vietnamese and Korean. All volunteers must complete training, a background check and sign the code of conduct. Contact the office for questions.



GUIDELINES FOR RECEIVING THE EUCHARIST

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

DIRECTRICES PARA RECIBIR LA EUCARISTÍA

No debes comer ni beber nada excepto agua o medicinas necesarias durante una hora antes de recibir la comunión. Esto se llama ayuno de la Comunión o Eucaristía. Esto es para ayudarnos a centrarnos en nuestro Señor y en lo que estamos a punto de recibir. Por tanto, masticar chicle, caramelos, mentas, etc. durante la misa es inapropiado. Ambas formas de recibir la hostia son aceptables, en la palma de una mano con la otra mano debajo, o en la lengua extendida. Extiende las manos con las palmas hacia arriba hacia el sacerdote y quédate lo más cerca posible del sacerdote al recibir la Comunión. Nunca le quites la hostia al sacerdote. Después de recibir la Eucaristía, dices Amén. La reverencia y el respeto adecuados son lo más importante; las manos deben estar cruzadas con reverencia mientras esperan recibir el Sacramento.

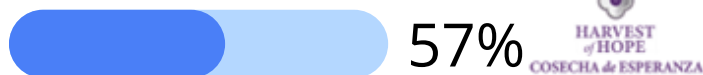

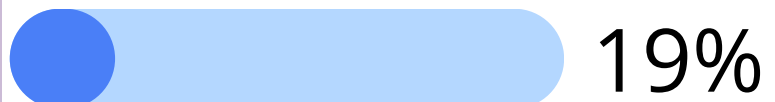

OCIA Classes Wednesdays: 7-8:30p in Social Hall
For Catholics and non-Catholics who wish to gain knowledge and information about the Catholic faith. The classes are also for those Catholic adults and high schoolers that have not completed their sacraments. The classes begin in September and will be completed by Easter.

Children's Religious Education

~Faith Formation~ Saint Stephen provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are for 1st – 8th grades and they meet Sundays at 9a Sept. to May.

Baptism - For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Matrimony - Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage **MUST** meet with the priest before setting a date.

Anointing of the Sick - Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick at First Friday's Mass at 5:30p.

Active Parishioner Status - Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors. An active member is one who is properly registered with the Parish office, regularly gives offertory, attends parish activities when possible and most importantly faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you may not be eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.
