

16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: WORK AND PRAY

"The Lord said to her in reply, 'Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her." (Lk 10:41-42)

WORD OF LIFE

Continuing with last week's theme, both the Gospel and the "Word of Life" now offer us not a parable but the beautiful story of Jesus' stay at the home of Martha and Mary. This text shows us not only two models of women, but also two different ways of behaving before God and His demands, as well as in the face of life itself. One of these models is the anxious and active Martha, and the other one is Mary who prays and listens. From our spirituality of gratitude, precisely because it is based on the imitation of the Virgin Mary, we must try to unite both models because what really matters is for us to express our gratitude to the Lord by loving. Sometimes, loving means praying and attending Mass and, at others, it means working, performing works of charity, and apostolic work.

Out of love, we have to be diligent and hard-working, just as Martha was. At the same time, also out of love, we have to be contemplative, like Mary. He who loves, prays. But, at the same time, he who loves, works. Our life should be spent in search of balance between both things; by listening to what God is asking of us at every moment and by trying to apply the "ora et labora" ("pray and work") of Saint Benedict. It often happens that he who prays also works, while the opposite is not always the case. So, we see people, even representatives of the Church such as some priests, who are very active but have no time for prayer. Therefore, praying is the first step in our apostolate. Knowing, of course, that the second step is service to others. And always and in everything, to love, for praying is loving, fulfilling our duties, and helping the needy.

<u>Purpose:</u> Do not omit personal prayer-not even for a single day-no matter what. Attend Mass daily and go to confession regularly. Be attentive to the needs of those around you.

DOMINGO XV DEL T. ORDINARIO: "ORA ET LABORA"

"El Señor le contestó: "Marta, Marta: andas inquieta y nerviosa con tantas cosas; sólo una es necesaria. María ha escogido la parte mejor y no se la quitarán." (Lc 10, 38-42)

PALABRA DE VIDA

Continuando con el tema de la semana anterior, el Evangelio, y con él la "palabra de vida", nos propone ahora no una parábola sino el hermoso relato de la estancia de Jesús en casa de Marta y María. Este texto nos muestra no sólo dos modelos de mujer, sino dos maneras diferentes de comportarse ante Dios y ante sus exigencias, así como ante la vida misma. Uno de esos modelos es la Marta inquieta y activa, y el otro es la María que reza y escucha. Desde nuestra espiritualidad del agradecimiento, precisamente porque está basada en la imitación de la Virgen María, tenemos que intentar unir los dos modelos, porque lo que de verdad nos importa es amar para expresarle el Señor nuestra gratitud.

Lo que pasa es que amar significa en unas ocasiones rezar e ir a misa y, en otras, trabajar y hacer obras de caridad o de apostolado. Por amor habrá que ser diligente y laborioso, como lo fue Marta. a la vez, también por amor, habrá que ser contemplativo, como María. El que ama, reza. Pero, a la vez, el que ama trabaja. Nuestra vida tiene que transcurrir en la búsqueda del equilibrio entre ambas cosas, escuchando lo que Dios nos pide en cada momento e intentando aplicar aquel "ora et labora" de San Benito. Por otro lado, suele suceder que el que reza también trabaja, mientras que no siempre ocurre lo contrario. Así, vemos a personas, incluso representativas de la Iglesia como algunos sacerdotes, que son muy activos pero que no tienen tiempo para la oración. Orar, por lo tanto, es el paso primero en nuestro movimiento. Sabiendo, eso sí, que el paso segundo es el servicio al prójimo. Y siempre y en todo, el amor. Porque rezar es amar y cumplir con nuestros deberes y ayudar al necesitado también lo es.

<u>Propósito</u>: No dejar la oración personal ni un sólo día, pase lo que pase. Procurar la misa diaria y la confesión frecuente. Estar atentos a las necesidades de los que nos rodean.

Registration for the upcoming Faith Formation Year has begun!


Sign up forms are in the Narthax and can be turned in with payment to the office or

Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. When a request is made, we must be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. Stephen's Parish.

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. 



RCIA Classes

Religious Education

Saint Stephen the First Martyr Catholic Church provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available starting with 1st graders and meet Sundays Sept. through May.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage MUST meet with the priest before setting a date.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Saturday of every month at 6pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick Tuesday's during the 12p Mass. If needed at another time please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.
