

17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: ASK AND YOU WILL RECEIVE.

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish?" (Lk 11:9-11)

WORD OF LIFE

The "Word of Life" for this week invites us to be humble before the Lord and to turn to Him with all our needs. Christ encourages us to ask and reminds us that God is Love and that He will always be attentive to our pleas.

However, there are some "buts." The first one is in the very essence of the petition. To ask means to beseech, not to demand. And generally speaking, we do not know how to ask. He who asks does not get angry if the request is not granted, for he knows that he is begging for something to which he has no right. Favors are requested, not demanded. Instead, although it may seem that we are asking, what we actually do is demand, as shown by our behavior when we are not given what we have requested: anger, estrangement from God, blackmail, or even loss of faith. Could it be that God did not grant it because we asked incorrectly? Maybe without realizing it, instead of asking, we were demanding?

The second drawback is that we ask only for material things. How should God feel about this behavior of ours? Wouldn't He be much more willing to help us if He saw that what concerns us, above all else, is holiness? What if we asked God with the same insistence for love of Him and our neighbor as we do for ourselves or our loved ones?

Lastly, the fact that the Lord encourages us to ask does not mean that we should just ask. Without gratitude, the request turns into selfishness and wearies the One Who is being asked for help.

<u>Purpose:</u> Ask with humility, telling God that it is fine if He does not give it to you. Ask for holiness, that is, to be in love with God. Be thankful for everything you have and offer yourself to Him.

DOMINGO XVI DEL T. ORDINARIO: "PEDID Y SE OS DARÁ"

"Así os digo a vosotros: Pedid y se os dará, buscad y hallaréis, llamad y se os abrirá; porque quien pide recibe, quien busca halla y al que llama se le abre. ¿Qué padre entre vosotros, cuando el hijo le pide pan, le dará una piedra?» (Lc 11, 9-13)

PALABRA DE VIDA

La "palabra de vida" de esta semana nos invita a ser humildes ante el Señor y a acudir a Él mostrándole nuestras necesidades. Cristo nos anima a pedir y nos recuerda que Dios es amor y que está siempre con los oídos abiertos para escuchar nuestras súplicas.

Sin embargo, hay algunos "peros". El primero está en la propia esencia de la petición. Pedir significa rogar, no exigir. Y nosotros no sabemos, por lo general, pedir. El que pide no se enfada si no se le concede lo pedido, pues sabe que está suplicando algo a lo que no tiene derecho. Los favores se solicitan, no se reclaman. En cambio, nosotros, aunque parezca que pedimos, en realidad lo que hacemos es exigir, como demuestra nuestro comportamiento cuando no nos dan lo que hemos pedido: enfados, alejamiento de Dios, incluso chantajes y pérdida de la fe. ¿No será que Dios no te lo concedió porque pedías mal, porque, quizá sin darte tú cuenta, más que pedir exigías?

El segundo inconveniente está en que sólo pedimos cosas materiales. ¿Cómo debe sentirse Dios ante este comportamiento nuestro?. ¿No estaría mucho más dispuesto a ayudarnos si viera que lo que nos preocupa por encima de todo es la santidad? ¿Y si probáramos a pedirle con la misma insistencia tanto el amor a Él y al prójimo como el resto de favores que suplicamos para nosotros o para los nuestros?

Por último, el que el Señor nos anime a pedir no significa que sólo debamos pedir. Sin agradecimiento, la petición se vuelve egoísmo y cansa a aquel al que se le está pidiendo ayuda.

<u>Propósito</u>: Pedir con humildad, diciéndole a Dios que si no nos lo concede no pasa nada. Pedir la santidad, es decir, el estar enamorado de Dios. Agradecer por todo lo que tenemos y ofrecernos.

Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. When a request is made, we must be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. Stephen's Parish.

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. 

Religious Education

Saint Stephen the First Martyr Catholic Church provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available starting with 1st graders and meet Sundays Sept. through May.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage MUST meet with the priest before setting a date.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Saturday of every month at 6pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick
