

18TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: SERVANT OF THE POOR.

"Then he said to the crowd, 'Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions.' Then he told them a parable. 'There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest... But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?'" (Lk 12:14-21)

WORD OF LIFE

We must renew our faith in Eternal Life. It is a very important truth, one of the key points of our religion. It alone gives us the true measure of things and helps us to relativize so many problems to which we give excessive importance. It is with this eternal dimension that we can confront our present difficulties, without losing peace and hope. Everything in this world will pass away; however, the world to come, eternity with God, will never pass away. With this perspective, we must also be charitable to our neighbor in need.

Although the first reason for our love of God and neighbor is gratitude to the Lord, Who has loved us so much, we must not forget the other reason, which the Lord reminds us of in this Sunday's parable: the reward for good works. Christ warns us that there is a hereafter, crossing through the narrow door of death, in which we will be judged by the love we have had in our earthly life. If we had that measure, that judgment, before us, we would not hesitate to serve the poor, because we would consider it a magnificent investment in our future, an investment that will provide us with the highest interest rates just when we need it the most.

Therefore, first out of gratitude, and second in order to receive from God the gift of Eternal Life, let's take care to guard against all kinds of greed. It is obvious that we have material needs and that it is advisable to be prudent and to save for possible future bad times. But do we have to save so much, while others can't even make it to tomorrow?

<u>Purpose:</u> Demonstrate your gratitude to God with good works. Give generously of your time or money to those in need.

DOMINGO XVIII DEL TO : "SERVIDOR DE LOS POBRES"

"Guardaos de toda clase de codicia. Pues, aunque uno ande sobrado, su vida no depende de sus bienes. Y les contó una parábola: 'Un hombre rico tuvo una gran cosecha... Pero Dios le dijo: Necio, esta noche te van a exigir la vida. Lo que has acumulado, ¿de quién será?". (Lc 12, 14-21)

PALABRA DE VIDA

Necesitamos renovar nuestra fe en la vida eterna. Es una verdad importantísima, una de las claves de nuestra religión. Sólo ella nos da la verdadera medida de las cosas y nos ayuda a relativizar tantos problemas a los que damos excesiva importancia. Es con esta dimensión eterna con la que podemos afrontar las dificultades del presente, sin perder la paz y la esperanza. Todo pasa en este mundo, pero en cambio el mundo venidero, la eternidad con Dios, no pasa nunca. Con esta perspectiva debemos afrontar también la caridad con el prójimo necesitado. Aunque el primer motivo de nuestro amor a Dios y al prójimo sea la gratitud hacia el Señor, que tanto nos ha amado, no hay que olvidar otro, que el Señor nos recuerda en la parábola de este domingo: el premio por las buenas obras. Cristo nos advierte de que hay un "más allá", cruzando la estrecha puerta de la muerte, en el que seremos juzgados por el amor que hayamos tenido en esta tierra. Si tuviéramos delante esa medida, ese juicio, no dudaríamos en servir a los pobres, pues lo consideraríamos una magnífica inversión de cara al futuro, una inversión que nos va a proporcionar los más elevados intereses justo cuando más los necesitaremos. Por lo tanto, primero por agradecimiento y en segundo lugar para poder recibir de Dios el regalo de la vida eterna, guardémonos de toda clase de codicia. Está claro que tenemos necesidades materiales y que es aconsejable ser prudente y guardar para posibles malas épocas. Pero ¿hay que guardar tanto, mientras otros no pueden ni siquiera llegar al día de mañana?

<u>Propósito:</u>: Demostrarle a Dios nuestra gratitud con las buenas obras, dándole a los que lo necesitan y con generosidad nuestro tiempo o nuestro dinero.

Registration for the upcoming Faith Formation Year has begun!


Sign up forms are in the Narthax and can be turned in with payment to the office or

Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. When a request is made, we must be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. Stephen's Parish.

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. Please be sure to register with the office and keep your information up to date! You can easily send an email to ssfmcc399@amail.com to make changes.



RCIA Classes

For Catholics and non-Catholics who wish to gain knowledge and information about the Catholic faith. The classes are also for those Catholic adults and high schoolers that have not completed their sacraments. The classes begin in September and will be completed by Easter. For additional information please call the office.

Religious Education

Saint Stephen the First Martyr Catholic Church provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available starting with 1st graders and meet Sundays Sept. through May.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage MUST meet with the priest before setting a date.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Saturday of every month at 6pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick the First Tuesday at the 12p Mass. If needed at another time please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.

Prayer Ministry
