20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: THE WORST EVIL IS INDIFFERENCE.

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing! There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished!" (Lk 12:49-50)

WORD OF LIFE

The "Word of Life" for this week invites us not to forget that tremendous phrase from the Book of Revelation, when the Lord's envoy is addressing the ancient Churches and tells one of them that "it is neither cold nor hot," adding that those who are similar, the lukewarm, God spits out of His mouth. Perhaps the worst isn't having defects but rather not having virtues. This is the worst sin. The ideal, certainly, is to be irreproachable. But, while we try to attain perfection, let's not forget that perfection will exist only when there are many good deeds in our hands and not when there are no bad deeds in them. Indeed, the worst evil is indifference.

Unfortunately, it is also the most frequent among "good Christians."

Naturally, rejecting indifference does not imply an obligation for us to solve all the problems of the world. We are not that great. But it does oblige us to do what we can, however little that may be. That is the only thing that God expects from us—that we do what we can do and do it well. Unfortunately, Catholics often seem sleepy, passive, or indifferent, even regarding the very crisis in which the Church is immersed, while members of other denominations or sects are extremely diligent and full of enthusiasm. From the spiritual perspective of gratitude, we must share the Lord's sentiments and desire that the world might know and love Him, that men might realize the greatness of His Divine Love and dedicate themselves to thanking Him, with works of love toward others for what they have received from Him.

<u>Purpose:</u> Do all you can to help others. Especially, comply with your apostolate duties. Convey to others a love for God.

DOMINGO XX DEL TO: "EL PEOR MAL: LA INDIFERENCIA"

PALABRA DE VIDA

La "palabra de vida" de esta semana nos invita a no olvidar aquella frase tremenda del Apocalipsis, cuando el enviado del Señor se está dirigiendo a las antiguas Iglesias y le dice a una de ellas que "no es ni carne ni pecado", añadiendo que a los que son como ella, a los tibios, Dios les vomita. Lo peor, quizá, no es tener defectos, sino no tener virtudes. Ese es el peor pecado. Lo ideal sería, ciertamente, ser irreprochable. Pero, mientras intentamos alcanzar la perfección, no olvidemos que esa perfección sólo existirá cuando se tengan muchas obras buenas en las manos y no sólo cuando no existan en ellas obras malas. No en vano, el peor mal es el de la indiferencia. Es, por desgracia, el más frecuente entre los "buenos cristianos".

Naturalmente que, el rechazo a la indiferencia no nos supone la obligación de convertirnos en los solucionadores de todos los problemas del mundo. No somos tan grandes. Pero sí nos obliga a hacer lo que podamos, por poco que sea. Eso es lo único que espera Dios de nosotros, que hagamos bien lo que podemos hacer. Por desgracia, los católicos parecen con frecuencia adormilados, pasivos, indiferentes incluso a la propia crisis en que está sumergida la Iglesia, mientras que miembros de otras confesiones o sectas se muestran enormemente diligentes y llenos de entusiasmo. Desde la perspectiva espiritual del agradecimiento, debemos compartir los sentimientos del Señor y desear, nosotros también, que el mundo le conozca y le ame, que los hombres se den cuenta de la grandeza del amor divino y que se dediquen a agradecerle con obras de amor al prójimo lo que de él han recibido.

<u>Propósito</u>: Hacer todo lo que puedo hacer por ayudar al prójimo. Muy en especial, atender los deberes del apostolado, transmitiendo a otros el amor a Dios.





Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

During my baseball career, my best coach often said, "You shouldn't be worried if I yell at you. Be worried if I don't. If I stop pushing you, it means I don't think you have any more potential." He demanded a lot, and I knew it meant he saw that I could be something special on the baseball field.

Jesus says some demanding words to us this week.

"Do you think I have come to establish peace on the earth?" he asks, "No, tell you, but rather division"

(Luke 12:51). He wants you and me-in fact, all the earth-to participate in the luminous glory of God. That's why he speaks of himself as a divine arsonist. Divine fire is like a good coach: it demands the removal of all that obstructs the achievement of the lofty goal.

How is your life demanding right now? That inconvenient family situation, the unfair boss at work, the kids who reject their parents' wishes, the nagging health issue? Maybe things would be more peaceful devoid of these seemingly arbitrary difficulties. But for us who believe in the one who comes to set the earth of fire, we should be much more worried if he stops demanding so much from us. In fact, let's thank him for it. He sees how glorious we can become.





Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.


