## 21<sup>st</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: BE THE FIRST TO ACT.

"Strive to enter through the narrow door... And people will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south and will recline at table in the kingdom of God. For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." (Lk 13:22-30)

### WORD OF LIFE

Christ speaks of a narrow door in the Gospel this week and urges us to enter through it. This is the door of love. A love that, at times, consists in living chastely, at other times, by being obedient, or by living austerely in the face of the temptations of consumerism, or by forgiving, or by enduring humiliation silently, or by defending clearly and loudly the innocent. Love has thousands of facets, each for the right moment. If we remain silent when we should speak, or if we speak when we should keep silent, it is a failure to love. That being said, love is the narrow, difficult door through which we must enter in order to imitate Christ and, therefore, to enter the Kingdom with Him.

But that is not sufficient. The "Word of Life" for this week hints at something else. It invites us to something else. It asks us to be the first to love, to not wait for others to do the things that need to be done, to speak up and defend those who suffer injustice, and to help the hungry with their alms. We must do so not out of pride, but out of gratitude. If Christ needs us, we cannot delay our response. We must hurry to give Him what He expects from us. It is not about pride, but about gratitude. Frequently, when we realize that something needs to be done and fail to act, it is left undone. So, if we do not make the first move, it is very possible that no one will feel motivated enough, and so what needs to be done will remain undone, and everyone will pay the consequences.

<u>Purpose:</u> When you realize that something needs to be done, do it. Do not wait for others to do it. Love is a blessing, and only by going through the door of love will you enter Heaven.

## DOMINGO XXI DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO: "SER LOS PRIMEROS"

"Jesús les dijo: Esforzaos en entrar por la puerta estrecha... Y vendrán de Oriente y Occidente, del Norte y del Sur, y se sentarán a la mesa en el Reino de Dios. Mirad, hay últimos que serán primeros y primeros que serán últimos". (Lc 13, 22-30)

### PALABRA DE VIDA

Cristo habla, en el Evangelio de esta semana, de una puerta estrecha, y nos insta a cruzarla, a pasar por ella. Esa puerta es la del amor. Un amor que a veces consiste en vivir la castidad, otras en obedecer, otras en mantener la austeridad frente a las tentaciones del consumismo, otras en perdonar, otras en aguantar en silencio una humillación, otras en hablar claro y alto para defender al inocente. El amor tienes mil facetas, cada una para el momento adecuado, de forma que si se calla cuando hay que hablar o si se habla cuando hay que guardar silencio, se falta al amor. Pues bien, el amor es la puerta estrecha y difícil que debemos cruzar para seguir e imitar a Cristo y, por consiguiente, para entrar con Él en el Reino.

Pero no basta con eso. La palabra de vida de esta semana nos sugiere algo más, nos invita a algo más. Nos pide que seamos los primeros en amar, que no esperemos a que otros hagan las cosas, hablen para defender al que sufre la injusticia o ayuden con su limosna al que pasa hambre. Tenemos que hacerlo no por soberbia, sino por agradecimiento. Si Cristo nos necesita —y nos necesita en el Sagrario y en el prójimo—, no podemos estar dilatando la respuesta, sino que debemos correr a darle lo que él espera de nosotros. No se trata, pues, de soberbia, sino de gratitud. Además, con frecuencia se comprueba que cuando alguien que se ha dado cuenta de que hay que hacer algo no lo hace, eso se queda sin hacer. Si no damos nosotros el primer paso, es muy posible que nadie se anime y lo que había que hacer permanece sin hacer, pagando todos las consecuencias.

<u>Propósito</u>: Cuando nos damos cuenta de que hay que hacer algo, hacerlo sin esperar a que sea otro el que lo haga. Amar es una suerte y que sólo pasando por la puerta del amor entraremos en el cielo.





### Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

## Registration for the upcoming Faith Formation Year has begun!


Sign up forms are in the Narthex and can be turned in with payment to the office or to Berta Ganaway.

### **Active Parishioner Status**

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. When a request is made, we must be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. Stephen's Parish.

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. 

### **Religious Education**

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Saturday of every month at 6pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.
