23rd SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: GOD HAS RIGHTS.

"Great crowds were traveling with him, and he turned and addressed them... 'Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.'"(Lk 14:25-27)

WORD OF LIFE

We know that there are ten commandments against which we can sin gravely, but usually Catholics who go to confession do so after having failed the fourth, fifth, sixth, or eighth commandment. Sins related to sex, life, family, or lying are the most frequent, or at least, they are the ones we are most aware of when we commit them. Unfortunately, almost no one examines their conscience regarding another sin, the sin against the first of the Ten Commandments, the one that refers to the need to put God first in our lives: "You shall love the Lord your God above all things." Actually, any of the other sins is also an infraction of this commandment. In order to respect and fulfill this commandment, it is enough to keep in mind that God has rights and that He has nothing less than the rights of God, the greatest of rights. That means that we have duties toward Him and that we have not done anything extraordinary whenever we fulfill our duties. We have not given Him "a gratuity" for which He should thank us. Rather, we have limited ourselves to simply fulfilling our obligation.

It is from this perspective that we have to analyze this Sunday's Gospel passage. Christ reminds us that He, as God, has the right to occupy the first place in our hearts. That is why He tells us that we cannot love our family more than Him and that if we are not capable of taking up our cross as He bore His, we cannot be His disciples. Faced with this just demand, there is only one thing that is left for us: to ask the Holy Spirit for the necessary help to be faithful to our vocation as Christians.

<u>Purpose:</u> Are you giving God what He has the right to expect from you? Do you accept with joy the cross that you have been given to bear for love of Him, just as He bore His out of love for you?

DOMINGO XXIII DEL TO: DIOS TIENE DERECHOS

"Mucha gente acompañaba a Jesús; Él se volvió y les dijo: Quien no lleve su cruz detrás de mí, no puede ser discípulo mío" (Lc 14, 25-27)

PALABRA DE VIDA

Sabemos que hay diez mandamientos contra los que se puede pecar gravemente, pero habitualmente los católicos que se confiesan lo hacen por haber faltado contra el sexto, el quinto, el cuarto o el octavo. Los pecados relacionados con el sexo, la vida, la familia o la mentira son los más frecuentes o, al menos, son aquellos de los que tenemos más conciencia cuando los cometemos. Por desgracia, casi nadie examina su conciencia sobre otro pecado, el pecado contra el primero de los diez mandamientos que hace referencia a la necesidad de poner a Dios en el primer lugar de la vida: "Amarás a Dios sobre todas las cosas". En realidad, cualquiera de los otros pecados es también una infracción contra este mandamiento. Para respetar y cumplir el primer mandamiento, basta con tener presente que Dios tiene derechos y que tiene, nada menos, que los derechos de Dios, los mayores derechos. Eso significa que nosotros tenemos deberes para con Él y que, cuando cumplimos con nuestro deber, no hemos hecho nada extraordinario, no le hemos dado "propina" que deba agradecernos, sino que nos hemos limitado a cumplir con nuestra obligación.

Es desde esta perspectiva desde la que debemos analizar el fragmento del Evangelio de este domingo. Cristo nos recuerda que Él, por ser Dios, tiene derecho a ocupar el primer lugar en nuestro corazón. Por eso nos dice que no podemos querer más a nuestra familia que a Él y que si no somos capaces de imitarle llevando nuestra cruz como Él llevó la suya, no podemos ser discípulos suyos. Ante esta justa exigencia, solo nos queda una cosa: pedirle al Espíritu Santo la ayuda necesaria para poder ser fieles a nuestra vocación de cristianos.

<u>Propósito:</u> ¿Le estoy dando a Dios lo que Él tiene derecho a esperar de mí? ¿Acepto con alegría la cruz que me ha tocado llevar por amor a Él, lo mismo que Él cogió la suya por amor a mí?



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Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

One hot Arizona summer afternoon my car ran out of gas. I phoned the parish office and begged for help. My secretary came and helped me fill the gas tank. She chided me, "If you can't manage getting your car from A to B, how can we expect you to guide the parish where it needs to go?" Point taken, Julie. I vowed to always make sure I have plenty of gas in my car.

The Lord Jesus chides us in this week's Gospel, too. He uses the two images of a man building a tower and a king marching soldiers into war to make this single point: acquire what is needed to follow him or look ridiculous. We rightly mock the builder who lacks money for his tower and the king with a short-handed army. But our mocking boomerangs back on us. How do we expect to follow Jesus to the end with insufficient detachment from our possessions and divided hearts?

The good news is, there is still time. Jesus is building a great tower to heaven-his own body. So we renounce all and give ourselves to him as his precious stones. Jesus is waging a battle against our enemy. So we forsake all and swear allegiance and march under his banner. In this way, we will finish what has begun in our discipleship. Or better put, our Lord will have the stones and soldiers required to see his great work through.





Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.


