24th SUNDAY IN OT*: Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross "LET YOURSELF BE DRAWN IN AND DRAW OTHERS IN"

"Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

(Jn 3, 14-17).

WORD OF LIFE

God's love is continually manifested in many ways, but the incarnation, suffering, death, and resurrection of Christ, together with his presence in the Eucharist, is the supreme and unsurpassable demonstration of that love. Seeing Christ crucified draws us to him, and in drawing us to him, it touches our hearts and thus gives rise to gratitude, the desire to love more each day the one who has loved us so much. The cross, with the Crucified One nailed to it, is proof of an infinite love that far surpasses any other gift we could receive from God: money, work, health... We often do not understand God's silence, but that silence is actually broken by the crucified Christ. When we see him, we must exclaim: I do not understand why you allow this or that to happen to me, but I do not doubt your love for me, because more valuable than this miracle I ask of you is the fact that you died for me to forgive my sins and open the gates of heaven to me.

And if this happens to us with Christ, it can also happen to others, not only seeing Him crucified, but seeing ourselves when we are suffering and, despite that, we do not despair, we do not become bitter, we do not turn away from Him, and it is from Him that we draw the strength to continue fighting, to forgive, to start again, to love even those who do not deserve it because they have hurt us or are hurting us. In this way, our suffering can become a testimony that draws people not to us, but to Christ, because, as St. Paul said, "I can do all things through him who strengthens me." This is the best example we can give to our family members when they are far from God.

<u>Purpose</u>: Contemplate the Crucified One, thank Him for His love, and allow yourself to be drawn to Him. Unite yourself to Him in your own cross to bear witness that with Christ you can be happy even when you are suffering.

PALABRA DE VIDA

El amor de Dios se manifiesta continuamente y de muchas maneras, pero la encarnación, suplicio, muerte y resurrección de Cristo, junto con su presencia en la Eucaristía, es la demostración suprema e insuperable de ese amor. Ver a Cristo crucificado nos atrae y, al atraernos, nos toca el corazón y así surge en nosotros el agradecimiento, el deseo de amar cada día más a quien nos ha amado tanto. La cruz, con el Crucificado clavado en ella, es la prueba de un amor infinito que supera con creces cualquier otro don que pudiéramos recibir de Dios: dinero, trabajo, salud... No entendemos muchas veces el silencio de Dios, pero ese es en realidad un silencio roto por el Cristo crucificado. Al verle debemos exclamar: no entiendo por qué permites que esto o lo otro me suceda, pero no dudo de tu amor por mí, porque más valioso que este milagro que te pido es el hecho de que Tú hayas muerto por mí para perdonar mis pecados y abrirme las puertas del cielo.

Y si esto nos sucede con Cristo, también puede pasarle a los demás, no sólo viéndole a Él crucificado, sino viéndonos a nosotros mismos cuando estamos sufriendo y, a pesar de eso, no nos desesperamos, no nos amargamos, no nos alejamos de Él y es de Él de quien sacamos las fuerzas para seguir luchando, para perdonar, para volver a empezar, para amar incluso a quien no se lo merece porque nos ha hecho o nos está haciendo daño. De ese modo, nuestro sufrimiento se puede convertir en un testimonio que atraiga, no hacia nosotros, sino hacia Cristo, porque, como dijo San Pablo: "Todo lo puedo en aquel que me conforta". Este es el mejor ejemplo que podemos dar a los de nuestra familia cuando están lejos de Dios.

<u>Propósito</u>: Contempla al Crucificado, dale las gracias por su amor y déjate atraer por Él. Únete a Él en tu propia cruz para ser testigo de que con Cristo se puede ser feliz incluso cuando se está sufriendo.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

One of my favorite movies is the 1991 comedy What About Bob? Bill Murray plays a troubled, paranoid hypochondriac named Bob Wiley who innocently but annoyingly hounds Dr. Leo Marvin, played by Richard Dreyfuss. Bob is paralyzed by his fear of, well, everything, and is convinced the psychologist can heal him. But Dr. Marvin's failed attempts to heal Bob end up driving the doctor to attempt to murder Bob. He fails. The surprise is that, having faced death head on, Bob is suddenly healed. He attributes his healing to Dr Marvin for breakthrough "death therapy." In facing the cause of his deepest illness and dysfunction, Bob is healed.

Underneath this light-hearted comedy is a dead-serious resonance with this week's feast: the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Christ is lifted up on the cross to force us to face the truth of sin and death. In that reckoning we find healing. Like Moses' snake on a pole, the cross says: this is what is causing your sickness - rebellion, disobedience, sin. Look at it! Don't run from it. Now seeing it exposed, we see life. We see our physician mercifully healing us. In this sense, we are all like Bob Wiley. The "death therapy" of the cross is our only hope for healing.

This week I invite you to "exalt the cross." If you don't have one in your house, get one. Use it for prayer. Gaze on it frequently. It teaches us to not be afraid. It heals us.

Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. When a request is made, we must be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. Stephen's Parish.

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. 





For Catholics and non-Catholics who wish to gain knowledge and information about the Catholic faith. The classes are also for those Catholic adults and high schoolers that have not completed their sacraments. The classes begin in September and will be completed by Easter. Religious Education

Saint Stephen the First Martyr Catholic Church provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available starting with 1st graders and meet Sundays Sept. through May.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage MUST meet with the priest before setting a date.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick
