26th SUNDAY IN OT: Take Advantage of What Has Been Given to Us

"He said, 'Then I beg you, father, send him to my father's house, for I have five brothers, so that he may warn them, lest they too come to this place of torment.' But Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.'" (Lk 16:27-31).

WORD OF LIFE

The parable of the rich man and poor Lazarus can be especially useful for those who say that if they do not see a miracle, they will not convert. In this Gospel's parable, they are given the answer they deserve: "If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead."

Actually, life is giving us continual occasions for conversion and gratitude. The proposal of this week's "Word of Life" consists precisely in examining those manifestations of God's love in order to take advantage of what has already been given to us and to fill our hearts with gratitude. We can do so by considering what would happen if we did not have the health we have, even if it is not perfect. Or, what we would do if we were not in the economic situation in which we find ourselves, if our friends stopped loving us, if our loved ones died, or if our family were not a happy household. It is possible that one or more of the things mentioned are missing, and that pain and even bitterness is ruining our lives. We have to remember then that maybe something of what we are lacking now, we did have at one time, and that there are many other things for which we can thank God and our neighbor. If we do not give thanks for what we have been given, what right do we have to complain about what we do not have? Will not our complaints, devoid of gratitude, invite the One, Who has given us everything, to take away what we have left because we value it so little that we do not appreciate it?

<u>Purpose:</u> Examine your motives for gratitude, beginning with God's love. Through your behavior, be consistent with the gratitude due to God and to your neighbor.

DOMINGO XXVI DEL TO: "Aprovechar lo que nos han dado"

"El rico insistió: 'Te ruego entonces, padre, que mandes a Lázaro a casa de mi padre, porque tengo cinco hermanos, para que, con su testimonio, evites que vengan también ellos a este lugar de tormento'. Abraham le dice: 'Tienen a Moisés y a los profetas: que los escuchen'. (Lc 16, 27-31)

PALABRA DE VIDA

La parábola del rico Epulón y del pobre Lázaro puede ser especialmente útil para aquellos que dicen que si no ven un milagro no se convierten. En la parábola evangélica se les da la respuesta que merecen: "Si no escuchan a Moisés y a los profetas, no harán caso ni aunque resucite un muerto". En realidad, la vida nos está dando continuas ocasiones para la conversión y para la gratitud. La propuesta de la "palabra de vida" de esta semana va a consistir precisamente en examinar esas manifestaciones del amor de Dios para aprovechar lo que ya nos han dado y, desde ahí, llenar nuestro corazón de gratitud. Lo haremos planteándonos qué ocurriría si no tuviéramos la salud que tenemos, aunque ésta no sea plena. O qué haríamos si no estuviéramos en la situación económica en que nos hallamos, o si nos dejaran de querer nuestros amigos, o fallecieran nuestros familiares, o nuestra familia no fuera un hogar feliz. Es posible que alguna de las cosas citadas, u otras, nos falte y que el dolor e incluso la amargura nos esté arruinando la vida. Debemos recordar entonces que quizá algo de lo que ahora nos falta algún día lo hemos tenido y, además, que hay otras muchas cosas por las que sí podemos agradecer a Dios y al prójimo. Si no damos gracias por lo que nos han dado, ¿qué derecho tenemos a quejarnos por lo que no tenemos?. ¿No serán nuestras quejas, carentes de gratitud, las que inviten a aquel que nos lo ha dado todo a quitarnos lo que nos queda, pues lo valoramos tan poco que no lo agradecemos?.

<u>Propósito</u>: Examinar los motivos de agradecimiento, empezando por el amor de Dios, y ser consecuentes a través de nuestro comportamiento con la gratitud debida al Señor y al prójimo

Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.



Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. When a request is made, we must be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. Stephen's Parish.

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. 

Religious Education

Saint Stephen the First Martyr Catholic Church provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available starting with 1st graders and meet Sundays Sept. through May.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage MUST meet with the priest before setting a date.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick the First Tuesday at the 12p Mass. If needed at another time please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.
