27th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Faith Translated into Actions

"The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith.' The Lord replied, 'If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.'" (Lk 17:5-6).

WORD OF LIFE

Generally, faith is understood to be trust in and acceptance of some intellectual mysteries that we do not fully understand. That is, certainly, an aspect of faith. For example, from this perspective, we may say correctly that we have faith in the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity or in the Real Presence of the Lord in the Eucharist.

But having faith not only means believing in something, but more than that, it also means loving something, wanting something, and fighting for something. However, there are too many Orthodox Christians, even in this time of crisis, who do not live a life consistent with their faith and certainly do not stand up for it. "Lord, help me to love you, increase my strength so that I may be willing to lay down my life for you. Enlighten me that I may love you more." This should be our prayer this week so that our faith will not be dead, but will be transformed into life.

That is the aspect of faith that Jesus invites us to strengthen with this Gospel. A faith that fills us with courage and makes us capable of facing adversity because we are sure that the Lord is with us. Because, in the end, the real defeat is not given to us by our enemies, but rather by ourselves when, due to lack of faith, we give up fighting for our principles. We may lose many battles and find ourselves reduced to an insignificant minority, but we

will not lose the war as long as we do not stop fighting. Defeat will only occur if we believe that it is not worth the fight or that God's strength is not on our side.

<u>Purpose:</u> Ask God for faith in His strength and in His love, as well as in the Church, and then do what He asks of you, even if it seems that it will be of no use.

DOMINGO XXVII DEL TO: Una fe que se traduzca en valor

"Los apóstoles dijeron al Señor: 'Auméntanos la fe'. El Señor contestó: 'Si tuvierais fe como un granito de mostaza, diríais a esa morera: 'Arráncate de raíz y plántate en el mar', y os obedecería'". (Lc 17, 5-6)

PALABRA DE VIDA

Generalmente, por fe se entiende confianza y aceptación de unos misterios intelectuales que no logramos entender del todo. Eso es, ciertamente, un aspecto de la fe. Desde esta perspectiva, decimos con razón que tenemos fe, por ejemplo, en el misterio de la Santísima Trinidad o en la presencia real del Señor en la Eucaristía.

Pero tener fe no significa sólo creer en algo, sino sobre todo significa amar algo, querer algo, luchar por algo. Hay demasiados cristianos ortodoxos, incluso en esta época de crisis, que sin embargo no llevan una vida coherente con su fe y que, desde luego, no dan la cara por la misma. "Señor, ayúdame a amarte, auméntame la fuerza para que esté dispuesto a dar la vida por ti. Dame más luz para que te ame más". Esta debería ser nuestra oración esta semana y así la fe no estará muerta, sino que se traducirá en vida. Esa es, además, el aspecto de la fe que Jesús nos invita a potenciar con este evangelio. Una fe que nos llene de valor y que nos haga capaces de afrontar las adversidades, porque estamos seguros de que el Señor está con nosotros. Porque, en definitiva, la verdadera derrota no nos la dan nuestros enemigos, sino que nos la damos nosotros cuando, por falta de fe, renunciamos a luchar por nuestros principios y según nuestros métodos. Podemos perder muchas batallas y vernos reducidos a una insignificante minoría, pero no perderemos la guerra mientras no dejemos de luchar y eso sólo ocurrirá cuando creamos que no merece la pena o que la razón y la fuerza de Dios no están de nuestra parte.

<u>Propósito:</u> Pedir a Dios fe en su fuerza y en su amor, así como en la Iglesia y, a continuación, hacer lo que Él nos pide, aunque parezca que no va a servir para nada

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Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A priest friend of mine received a call from a family whose elderly mother was dying. Within thirty minutes, he was at her bedside, offering the consolation of the sacraments, anointing her with the oil of the sick, and commending her soul to God. She passed not long after, and for months, her family spoke of their deep gratitude for his presence. When I phoned him to commend his faithful ministry, he simply said, "I was just doing my job."

His words brought to mind Jesus' teaching this week in Luke 17:10: "So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty." In a world that often seeks recognition and applause, the Lord invites us into a different mindset — one of humble service. The priest did not see his response as extraordinary; he saw it as a grace to fulfill his vocation.


How tempting it is to seek affirmation for doing what I ought to do! Yet Jesus reminds us that true discipleship is not about grandstanding but about quiet faithfulness. It is enough to have served. It is enough to have loved. It is enough to be grateful that we were given the chance to do our duty in the first place. Whether in priesthood, parenthood, or any vocation, what peace-soaked freedom there is in simply doing what is asked of us. No more, no less. Jesus, that is how you quietly love us.



Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.





Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. When a request is made, we must be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. Stephen's Parish.

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. Please be sure to register with the office and keep your information up to date! You can easily send an email to ssfmcc399@gmail.com to make changes.

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. An active member is one who is properly registered with the Parish office, regularly gives offertory, attends parish activities when possible and most importantly faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.
