# 29th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Persevere

"Jesus told his disciples a parable about the necessity for them to pray always without becoming weary. He said, 'There was a judge in a certain town who neither feared God nor respected any human being. And a widow in that town used to come to him and say, 'Render a just decision for me against my adversary.' For a long time, the judge was unwilling but eventually he thought, 'While it is true that I neither fear God nor respect any human being, because this widow keeps bothering me I shall deliver a just decision for her lest she finally come and strike me.' The Lord said, 'Pay attention to what the dishonest judge says. Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night? Will he be slow to answer them? I tell you, he will see to it that justice is done for them speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?'" (Lk 18:1-8).

# WORD OF LIFE

The best proof of the degree of interest we have in something is the perseverance we put into accomplishing it. If, at the first failure, we stop fighting for what we want, it is because it was never very important to us. On the other hand, when something really concerns us, we persevere until we either accomplish it or we see that it is absolutely impossible. If we do that with the things of this world, why don't we do the same with the things of God? Do we ask the Lord for holiness with the same intensity as we do for a job, or for overcoming our defects as we do for success in our studies? We say that we want to love Him, and that's true, but in practice we do not devote the same passion toward Him as we do to our work, to our friends, to having fun, or to relaxing. Therefore, let's persevere in asking the Lord for holiness and the means to achieve it. This perseverance will serve not only as proof that we want to be holy but also as an act of trusting that God has the power to accomplish such a great miracle.

On the other hand, our perseverance must be humble, knowing that we are asking for a favor and not claiming it as a right; otherwise, the only thing we will accomplish by our pride is to offend the one we ask for help, in this case, God.

<u>Purpose:</u> Every day in prayer ask God for holiness for yourself and for others, realizing that it is the most important treasure. Do everything necessary to become a saint.

# **DOMINGO XXIX: Insistir**

"Jesús, para explicar a los discípulos cómo tenían que orar siempre sin desanimarse, les propuso esta parábola: 'Había un juez en una ciudad que ni temía a Dios ni le importaban los hombres. En la misma ciudad había una viuda que solía ir a decirle: 'Hazme justicia frente a mi adversario'; por algún tiempo se negó, pero después se dijo: 'Aunque ni temo a Dios ni me importan los hombres, como esa viuda me está fastidiando, le haré justicia, no vaya a acabar pegándome en la cara'. Y el Señor respondió: 'Fijaos en lo que dice el juez injusto; pues Dios, ¿no hará justicia a sus elegidos que le gritan día y noche?, ¿o les dará largas? Os digo que les hará justicia sin tardar. Pero cuando venga el hijo del hombre, ¿encontrará esta fe en la tierra?'". (Lc 18, 1-8)

# PALABRA DE VIDA

La mejor prueba del grado de interés que tenemos en algo es la perseverancia que ponemos en conseguirlo. Si al primer fracaso dejamos de luchar por lo que pretendíamos, es que no nos importaba demasiado. En cambio, cuando algo nos preocupa de verdad, insistimos hasta que lo logramos o hasta que vemos que es absolutamente imposible. Si eso hacemos con las cosas del mundo, ¿por qué no hacemos lo mismo con las cosas de Dios?. ¿Pedimos al Señor, con la misma intensidad, la santidad que el trabajo, la superación de nuestros defectos que el éxito en los estudios? Decimos que queremos amarle, y es verdad, pero en la práctica no le dedicamos el mismo interés que a nuestro trabajo, a nuestros amigos o a la diversión y el descanso. Insistamos, pues, en pedirle al Señor la santidad y en poner los medios para conseguirla. Esa insistencia será una prueba de que queremos ser santos, a la vez que un acto de confianza en Dios y en que Él tiene la fuerza para conseguir un milagro tan grande.

Por otro lado, la insistencia tiene que ser humilde, sabiendo que estamos pidiendo un favor y no reclamando un derecho, pues de lo contrario lo único que conseguiremos con nuestra soberbia es ofender a aquel al que pedimos ayuda, en este caso a Dios.

<u>Propósito:</u> Pedir a Dios por nuestra santidad todos los días en la oración y pedir también por la de los demás, sabiendo que es el principal tesoro. Poner los medios para conseguirla.


# School of Gratitude



# Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.


# Life Chain successful Despite Heavy Rains

# **Active Parishioner Status**

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. When a request is made, we must be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. Stephen's Parish.

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.
