

30th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Repentance and Work

"Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else. 'Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, 'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity—greedy, dishonest, and adulterous—or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole income.' But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me, a sinner.' I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." (Lk 18:9-14).

DOMINGO XXX DEL TO: Arrepentimiento y trabajo

"Dijo Jesús esta parábola por algunos que, teniéndose por justos, se sentían seguros de sí mismos y despreciaban a los demás: 'Dos hombres subieron al templo a orar. Uno era un fariseo; el otro, un publicano. El fariseo, erguido, oraba así en su interior: '¡Oh Dios!, te doy gracias porque no soy como los demás: ladrones, injustos, adúlteros; ni como ese publicano. Ayuno dos veces por semana y pago el diezmo de todo lo que tengo'. El publicano, en cambio, se quedó atrás y no se atrevía ni a levantar los ojos al cielo; sólo se golpeaba el pecho, diciendo: '¡Oh Dios!, ten compasión de este pecador'. Os digo que éste bajó a su casa justificado y aquel no. Porque todo el que se enaltece será humillado, y el que se humilla será enaltecido". (Lc 18, 9-14)

WORD OF LIFE

It often happens that arrogance hides beneath the charm of charity. So, for many, the more good deeds they do, the more conceited they become and the more they judge others since they consider themselves above everyone else. This is a serious lack of humility, and without humility, there is no holiness. In fact, there are people who seem good and do many good deeds, but despite this, they are not saintly because they are full of vanity and pride. Deep down, they consider themselves superior to everyone else, and when they feel hurt or unappreciated, they immediately become angry and even distance themselves from God. This week's Gospel invites us to repent and acknowledge our faults with humility, and to thank God for the good deeds that, with His help, we are capable of doing. Therefore, do not just thank God for being good, like the Pharisee, but also acknowledge that without Him we would not be good. At the same time, do not judge others because only God knows the mystery of the human heart. That does not mean that we cannot judge the actions of others, but we must not judge their intention or their conscience. Do as the Church teaches: denounce the sin and try to save the sinner.

<u>Purpose:</u> After having made an examination of conscience and asking God for forgiveness, go to confession. Give thanks to God for His good deeds. Do not judge those who do not thank Him.

PALABRA DE VIDA

Suele suceder que la soberbia se esconde bajo las galas de la bondad. Así, para muchos, cuanto más cosas buenas hacen, más engreídos están y más juzgan a los demás porque les consideran peores que ellos. Es una falta grave de humildad y, sin humildad, no hay santidad. De hecho, hay personas que parecen buenas y que incluso hacen muchas cosas buenas, a pesar de lo cual no son santas, porque están llenas de vanidad y de soberbia. En el fondo, se consideran a sí mismas superiores a los demás y cuando algo les perjudica o cuando creen que no se les ha hecho el caso debido, enseguida se enfadan y hasta se alejan de Dios. El Evangelio de esta semana nos invita a arrepentirnos y reconocer nuestras faltas con humildad y a darle gracias a Dios por las cosas buenas que, con su ayuda, somos capaces de hacer. Por lo tanto, no sólo a darle gracias a Dios por ser buenos, pues eso también lo hacía el fariseo, sino a ser conscientes de que sin Él no seríamos buenos y, a la vez, a no juzgar a nadie, porque sólo Dios conoce el misterio del corazón humano. Eso no significa que no podamos juzgar las obras de los demás, sino la intención o la conciencia de lo que hace. Hagamos lo que aconseja la Iglesia: condenar el pecado e intentar salvar al pecador.

<u>Propósito</u>: Confesarnos, tras hacer examen de conciencia y pedir perdón a Dios. Darle gracias al Señor por hacer algo bien y no juzgar a los que no lo hacen.


WE PRAY TOGETHER







Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. When a request is made, we must be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. Stephen's Parish.

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. 

Religious Education

Saint Stephen the First Martyr Catholic Church provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available starting with 1st graders and meet Sundays Sept. through May.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage MUST meet with the priest before setting a date.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick during the First Friday's Mass at 12p. If needed at another time please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.
