

## 34<sup>th</sup> Sunday In Ordinary Time: Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe: Share the Crown

"The people stood by and watched; the rulers, meanwhile, sneered at him and said, 'He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Messiah of God.' Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine, they called out, 'If you are King of the Jews, save yourself.'"(Lk 23:35-37).

## WORD OF LIFE

The Church always ends the liturgical year with a special feast day: the Solemnity of Christ the King. With this, it wants to proclaim the conviction that Jesus of Nazareth is the Son of God, the real Lord of the Universe. However, this faith in the divinity and power of Christ does not hide the frailty of the Lord; and that is why the Gospel that the Church selected for this Sunday shows Christ at His most vulnerable, His greatest prostration: that of the Cross.

On this year's Solemnity of Christ the King, the "Word of Life" invites us to re-member that the Lord, Whom we love and worship, is crowned with thorns, and not with gold or diamonds. This should lead us to sympathize with Him. It cannot be any other way if we truly love Him. Could a mother live in abundance while her children die of hunger? Is it possible for a friend to squander everything while his companion suffers hardships?

Well, if "no" is our only answer to these questions, then our answer should be the same to the question we ask ourselves concerning our solidarity with the King crowned with thorns.

We cannot have a clean conscience while He is suffering today as He did then; suffering hunger, thirst, loneliness, and injustice. We must hurry to free Him from His crown of pain, and to do so, we must remove it from those who wear it: all those who suffer. Naturally, we will prick ourselves with the thorns in doing so, but that will be a price that we will gladly pay to alleviate the pain of He Who is first in our lives:

Christ, Our King.

<u>Purpose:</u> Worship Christ. Put Him first in your life by performing works of love for those in need. It is by helping them that you help your Crucified Lord.

## Domingo XXXIV del T.O: Cristo Rey: compartir la corona

"Las autoridades y el pueblo hacían muecas a Jesús, diciendo 'A otros ha salvado; que se salve a sí mismo si él es el mesías a Dios, el elegido'. Se burlaban de él también los soldado ofreciéndole vinagre y diciendo: 'Si eres tú el rey de los judío sálvate a ti mismo'". (Lc 23, 35-38)

## PALABRA DE VIDA

La Iglesia termina siempre el año litúrgico con una fiesta especial: la solemnidad de Cristo Rey. Con ella quiere proclamar su convicción de que Jesús de Nazaret es el Hijo de Dios, auténtico Señor del Universo. Pero esta fe en la divinidad y el poder de Cristo no le lleva a ocultar la debilidad del Señor y, por eso, selecciona como texto para la lectura del Evangelio dominical aquel en el que se muestra a Cristo en su mayor fragilidad, en su mayor postración: el de la Cruz.

En la solemnidad de Cristo Rey de este año, la "palabra de vida" nos invita a recordar que el Señor al que amamos y adoramos está coronado de espinas y no de oro o diamantes. Y eso nos lleva a desear solidarizarnos con él. No puede ser de otra manera si de verdad le queremos. ¿Podría una madre vivir en la abundancia mientras sus hijos mueren de hambre? ¿Le es posible a un amigo derrochar mientras su compañero pasa penalidades?.

Pues bien, si esas preguntas sólo tienen el "no" como respuesta, lo mismo debemos contestar nosotros a la pregunta que tenemos que hacernos sobre nuestra solidaridad con el Rey coronado de espinas. No podemos tener la conciencia tranquila mientras él esté así, hoy como entonces, sufriendo hambre, sed, soledad e injusticia. Debemos apresurarnos para ir a liberarle de su corona de dolor y para hacerlo tenemos que quitársela de la frente a los que la llevan: todos los que sufren. Naturalmente que nos pincharemos con las espinas al hacerlo, pero ese será el precio que pagaremos gustosos por aliviar el dolor de aquel que es el primero en nuestra vida, nuestro Rey, Cristo.

<u>Propósito</u>: Adorar a Cristo y ponerle en el primer lugar de la vida con obras concretas de amor al prójimo necesitado, pues ayudando a éste ayudamos a nuestro Señor crucificado.





# Harvest of Hope VOCATIONS ENDOWMENT

## THE BENEFIT OF ENDOWMENTS

An endowment fund is an investment portfolio that generates income for a nonprofit or charitable organization. The principal amount remains intact, while the earnings from investments are used for a specific purpose. The diocese recognizes that some projects are ongoing and will need support for years to come, and endowments help to safeguard the monies raised.

# HARVEST OF HOPE CREATES A VOCATIONS ENDOWMENT

The Harvest of Hope campaign will create a \$5,000,000 vocations endowment. Held in the Catholic Foundation of South Georgia, this endowment will be allowed to mature for five years.

Following that five year period, interest on the endowment will be used to support a culture of vocations across the diocese. The diocese has a goal of educating and forming 30 seminarians at a cost of \$56,000 per seminarian per year. We pray this goal becomes a reality.

For the rest of this year, we will pray, we will learn, and we will consider how our sacrifice, along with that of all the faithful of the diocese, will enable our growth, both at St. Stephen First Martyr and throughout the Diocese of Savannah.

Después de ese período de cinco años, los intereses del fondo patrimonial se utilizarán para apoyar una cultura vocacional en toda la diócesis. La diócesis tiene el objetivo de educar y formar a 30 seminaristas a un coste de 56.000 dólares al año por seminarista. Rezamos para que este objetivo se haga realidad.





## Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

## **Active Parishioner Status**

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. When a request is made, we must be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. Stephen's Parish.

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, Godparents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.
