

WORD OF LIFE

Advent begins, and with it, a new liturgical year. The time begins to prepare for Christmas and, as all beginnings, there is a lot of novelty, despite what we are going to remember and renew – the coming of the Son of God – is already known by all.

The attitude with which the Church invites us to begin this time of preparation is that of being vigilant, to be getting ourselves in shape so that the arrival of the Lord does not take us by surprise or poorly prepared. Because of this, the "word of life" for this week tells us we should act as if we were going to receive at home a very special guest, the most important, and as if we risked that, by not being alert, he would go by without stopping. Of course, to have this attitude, it is necessary that we are truly interested in his coming and in taking him into our home, it is necessary that we consider the meeting with him as the best luck that life could offer us. Unfortunately, if going to mass or taking communion were attached to receiving money or having a few more grams of health, surely there would be many who wouldn't miss the Sunday appointment. What would I be willing to do for a million euros? No physical sacrifice would be scorned, nor effort not confronted; it wouldn't matter how early the alarm had to wake me or the patience I had to have with my boss. And for you, Lord? Aren't you worth more than that? Doesn't your friendship have a higher worth than the money? Who was at my side when my friends failed me? Who will be with me when death arrives? Who has done for me even a small part of what you have done for me?

Christ needs that you love him for himself and is waiting for you to take him as your best guest.

<u>Purpose:</u> Prepare ourselves to take Christ into our lives with a good examination of our conscience, to discover that we have done wrong and try to correct it. Pray and go to mass more.

PALABRA DE VIDA

Empieza el Adviento y, con él, un nuevo año litúrgico. Comienza el tiempo dedicado a preparar la Navidad y, como todo comienzo, tiene mucho de novedad, a pesar de que lo que vamos a recordar y renovar -la venida del Hijo de Dios- es ya conocido por todos.

La actitud con la que la Iglesia nos invita a estrenar este tiempo de preparación es la de estar en vela, la de irnos poniendo en condiciones para que la llegada del Señor no nos coja ni desprevenidos ni poco preparados. Por eso, la "palabra de vida" de esta semana nos dice que deberíamos actuar como si en casa fuéramos a recibir a un invitado muy importante, el más importante, y como si corriéramos el riesgo de que, de no estar alerta, él pasara de largo sin detenerse. Claro que, para tener esta actitud, hace falta que nos interese de verdad su venida y acogerle en nuestra casa, hace falta que consideremos el encuentro con él como la mayor suerte que nos ha podido deparar la vida. Por desgracia, si ir a misa o comulgar estuviera unido a recibir dinero o tener unos gramos más de salud, seguro que habría muchos que no faltarían a la cita dominical. ¿Qué estaría yo dispuesto a hacer por un millón de euros? No habría sacrificio físico que despreciase, ni esfuerzo que no afrontase; no me importaría lo temprano que tuviese que sonar el despertador o la paciencia que tuviese que emplear con mi jefe. ¿Y por ti, Señor? ¿Es que no vales tú más que eso? ¿Es que tu amistad no tiene un valor mayor que el dinero? ¿Quién estaba a mi lado cuando me fallaron los amigos? ¿Quién estará cuando me llegue la muerte? ¿Quién ha hecho por mí tan solo una pequeña parte de lo que has hecho tú?

Cristo necesita que le quieras por él mismo y está esperando que le acojas como el mejor invitado.

<u>Propósito:</u> Prepararnos para acoger a Cristo en nuestra vida con un buen examen de conciencia, para descubrir qué hemos hecho mal e intentar corregirlo. Rezar e ir a misa más.

Jesus, I ask for your help.


I ask for spiritual graces, such as the overcoming of my defects and for material help, for me, for others and for society.





Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

Active Parishioner Status

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. 



Religious Education

Saint Stephen the First Martyr Catholic Church provides opportunities for each person to receive the Sacraments and grow in greater communion with our Lord. Classes are available starting with 1st graders and meet Sundays Sept. through May.

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage MUST meet with the priest before setting a date.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick

Fr. Estrada is offering Anointing of the Sick during the First Friday's Mass at 12p. If needed at another time please contact the office or Father Estrada directly.
