3rd Sunday of Advent: Announce the Good News to the Poor

"Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. And blessed is the one who takes no offense at me." (Mt 11:4-6).

Domingo III Adviento: Anunciar a los pobres

"Id a anunciar a Juan lo que estáis viendo y oyendo: los ciegos ven los inválidos andan; los leprosos quedan limpios y los sordos oyen; le muertos resucitan y a los pobres se les anuncia la buena noticia.; dichoso el que no se siente defraudado por mí!" (Mt 11, 2-6).

WORD OF LIFE

Who are the poor? They are those who suffer from a physical or material need. They are the multitudes of farmers and laborers in South America, Africa, or Asia, those who dwell in the marginal neighborhoods of the large cities, the immigrants, those hated because of their race, religion, or some deficiency that makes them incapable of competing in a society such as ours. These are the first poor, and it would be an offense to forget them.

But it would also be an error to forget the poor who live alone, those suffering the consequences of the break-up of a marriage, those who are ill, and, in short, all those who suffer for one reason or another. All carry in their bodies or in their spirits the mark of the Crucified One, who on the cross not only suffered the pain of the nails and the thorns but also the abandonment of His friends.

What then does the announcing of the Good News to the poor mean? It means helping them solve their problems, with all of our strength, but, at the same time, offering them the personal experience of our encounter with God, Who is the only One Who can truly help them, and the only One Who can give them, and everyone else, true happiness.

Also, there is something else in this week's "Word of Life": the exclamation of Christ calling blessed those who do not feel disappointed by Him. In other words, those who do not believe that He does nothing because He rejects violence as a means to resolve problems, or because He does not perform miracles so that these problems disappear.

<u>Purpose:</u> Help all who suffer, insofar as you are able, with almsgiving or companionship. But also, speak to them of God. Do not doubt Christ nor the effectiveness of His message.

PALABRA DE VIDA

¿Quiénes son los pobres? Son, en primer lugar, aquellos que padecen necesidad física, material; son las muchedumbres de campesinos de Iberoamérica, África o Asia; los habitantes de los barrios periféricos en las grandes ciudades; los emigrantes; los despreciados por causa de su raza, por su religión o por alguna deficiencia que les hace incapaces de competir en una sociedad como la nuestra. Estos son los primeros pobres, y olvidarlo es una ofensa para ellos.

Pero también es un error olvidar que son pobres los que viven solos, los que padecen las consecuencias de una ruptura matrimonial, los que están enfermos y, en definitiva, todos aquellos que por un motivo u otro sufren. Unos y otros llevan en su cuerpo o en su espíritu la marca del Crucificado, que en la cruz no sólo padeció por los clavos y las espinas, sino también por el abandono de los amigos.

¿Qué significa, entonces, anunciar la buena noticia a los pobres? Significa ayudarles a solucionar sus problemas, con todas nuestras fuerzas. Pero, a la vez, ofrecerles la experiencia personal del encuentro con Dios, que es quien verdaderamente les puede ayudar y el único que a ellos, como a todos los demás, les va a dar la felicidad.

Además, hay otra cosa en esta "palabra de vida": la exclamación de Cristo llamando dichoso al que no se sienta defraudado por Él. Es decir, al que no crea que Él no hace nada porque rechaza la violencia como medio para solucionar los problemas, o porque no hace milagros para que éstos desaparezcan.

<u>Propósito</u>: Ayudar a todo aquel que sufre, con la limosna o con la compañía, en la medida de nuestras fuerzas. Pero también hablarles de Dios. Y no dudar de Cristo ni de la eficacia de su mensaje.

Jesus, I ask for your help.


I ask for spiritual graces, such as the overcoming of my defects and for material help, for me, for others and for society.





Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.

Active Parishioner Status

Each year we receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings, be godparents or sponsors for the Sacrament of Confirmation, Communion and Baptism. When a request is made, we must be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. Stephen's Parish.

An active member is one who 1) Is properly registered with the Parish office and gives regular to the offertory through envelopes or online giving. 2) Faithfully attends Mass on Sunday's and Holy days of Obligation.

Even though you attend Mass, if you are not registered with the Parish, we have no information about you and you are not eligible to be Sponsors, God-parents, etc. While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. Religious Education

Matrimony

Arrangements must be made at least 6 months in advance of the proposed date. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required. Couples contemplating marriage MUST meet with the priest before setting a date.

Baptism

For a child to be baptized, you must be attending Mass regularly, attend a Baptism class and fill out a registration form. Classes are held the last Sunday of every month at 1pm and must be completed prior to scheduling baptism date. One Godparent must be an active Catholic and attend class as well. A copy of the Child's Birth Certificate is needed at time of registration. Please contact the Office for scheduling.

Anointing of the Sick
