"It was of him that the prophet Isaiah had spoken when he said: 'A voice of one crying out in the desert, 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths.'" (Mt 3:3).

WORD OF LIFE

They say that some people are friends for only a season. And that is true. It is during difficult times that we can see authentic friendship. The more difficult John the Baptist's preaching was, the more merit and value it had as he announced the coming of Jesus, the Messiah and Savior. To openly confess faith in Christ and fidelity to the Pope has much more merit and is more necessary today than 50 years ago, when doing the opposite was strange and frowned upon. Now is when it is most needed, when the Lord needs it the most. The same can be said, for example, about vocations to the religious life and the priesthood. In the past, when there were not many alternatives for young people, the seminaries and novitiates were full; now, they are almost empty. However, it is now that Christ has the most need of young men and women willing to dedicate their lives to evangelization and to the service of those who suffer.

Each one of us frequently feels surrounded by a desert even within our souls. Criticisms of the Church and her moral teachings surround us in abundance. Interiorly, we might even doubt that it is possible to live the Gospel faithfully, or that it is even worth doing so. The desert is both inside and outside and threatens to devour everything, to dry the springs of living water that come to us through the sacraments and that produce fruits of love in our hands. We must do like John: confront the desert with the water of God's grace to make it subside and produce fruitful results where there was once nothing but dryness and aridity. In order to do this, we must have courage and accept the fatigue of hard work; we must be provided with the necessary help through prayer, the sacraments, and trust in the grace of God.

<u>Purpose:</u> Do not be ashamed of Christ or of the Church. Defend them intelligently and without violence. Abound in works of love in order to bear witness to what faith and grace can do in man.

PALABRA DE VIDA

Dicen que los amigos son para las ocasiones. Y es verdad. Es en los momentos difíciles cuando se nota la autenticidad de la amistad. La predicación del Bautista, anunciando la llegada de Jesús, del Mesías Salvador, tenía tanto más mérito y valor cuanto más difícil era. Confesar abiertamente la fe en Cristo y la fidelidad al Papa es mucho más meritorio y necesario hoy que en los años 50, cuando lo extraño y mal visto era lo contrario. Pero es ahora cuando más falta hace, cuando el Señor más lo necesita. Lo mismo se puede decir, por ejemplo, de la vocación a la consagración y al sacerdocio; antes, cuando no había muchas alternativas para los jóvenes, los seminarios y noviciados estaban llenos; ahora, están casi vacíos. Y, sin embargo, es ahora cuando más necesita Cristo a muchachos y muchachas que quieran dedicarse a tiempo pleno a la evangelización y al servicio de los que sufren.

Cada uno de nosotros, cada día y con frecuencia varias veces al día, se siente rodeado de desierto e incluso con el desierto en el alma. A tu alrededor abundan las críticas a la Iglesia y a la moral católica. En tu propio interior, llegas incluso a dudar que sea posible vivir fielmente el Evangelio o que merezca la pena hacerlo. El desierto está dentro y está fuera, y amenaza con devorarlo todo, con secar los manantiales de agua viva que nos llegan a través de los sacramentos y que producen frutos de amor en nuestras manos. Hay que hacer como Juan: enfrentarse al desierto con el agua de la gracia de Dios, para hacerlo retroceder, para que se produzcan frutos donde antes no había nada más que aridez y sequía. Y para eso hay que tener valor y aceptar el cansancio del trabajo duro, hay que proveerse bien de los materiales necesarios mediante la oración y los sacramentos, hay que confiar en la gracia. Cristo necesita que le quieras por él mismo y está esperando que le acojas como el mejor invitado.

<u>Propósito</u>: No avergonzarnos de Cristo ni de la Iglesia. Defenderlos con inteligencia, sin violencia. Abundar en obras de amor para dar testimonio de lo que la fe y la gracia hacen en el hombre.

Jesus, I ask for your help.


I ask for spiritual graces, such as the overcoming of my defects and for material help, for me, for others and for society.



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



Guidelines for Receiving the Eucharist

You are not to eat or drink anything except for water or required medicine, for one hour before actually receiving communion. This is called the Communion or Eucharist fast. It is meant to help us focus on our Lord and what we are about to receive. Chewing gum, candy, mints, etc. during Mass is therefore inappropriate. Both forms for receiving the host are acceptable, in the palm of one hand with the other hand underneath, or on the extended tongue. Extend your hands palm-side up toward the priest and stand as close to the priest as possible when receiving Communion. Never take the host from the priest. After receiving the Eucharist, you say Amen. Proper reverence and respect is most important, hands should be reverently folded while waiting to receive the Sacrament.
