Visit to Spode factory, Stoke upon Trent



The coach trip to Stoke on Trent, or to be more precise Stoke upon Trent, on Wednesday 17 April, went well and the hosts at the Spode Museum and

from the Potteries Heritage Society had gone to a lot of trouble for us, although it was disappointing that only 15 people had booked to come.

However, those of us who did attend were treated to an expert guided walk around the area surrounding the Spode Factory, showing us what a major part in the town's life and trade the factory played, providing employment and leading to the construction of the canal connection into the national system, to enable raw materials to be brought in and finished products shipped out. We were also given a detailed explanation of the intricacies of the design and manufacture of the famous blue and white willow pattern china, for which the factory was famous. We even had a practical demonstration of the enormously skilled process of applying the pattern to porcelain blanks ready for firing, and were able to make one for ourselves. I think we all felt it was a memorable visit.



Visit to York ~ Friday 14 July

Our party of thirty set off promptly, and a bit earlier than usual, from The Meres at 8.15am for the trip with A&P Coaches to York. We had feared encountering traffic problems on the journey but in fact arrived at the Coach Station in good time for a stroll across the City and a cup of coffee in various cafes in the area around The Mansion House, home to the Lord Mayor of York and the venue for many of the City's civic ceremonies.

We were then given a warm welcome by the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress of York, Revd. Cllr. Chris Cullwick and Mrs Joy Cullwick. Amongst our visiting party was our own new Town Mayor, Mark Whittington. Mark and Chris were able to share experiences of their own different roles and compare regalia, although Mark was at pains to point out that his own "Sunday best" regalia had to stay in Grantham for insurance reasons! We were then given an extremely informative and humorous tour, by a guide called Olivia, of the principal rooms of the Mansion House, construction of which was completed in 1732 and has remained in continuous use since then. We were even shown around the kitchen in the basement, set up as it would originally have been with the original table, fitments and fireplace, including the unusual "smoke jack" by which the heat of the fire turned the spit upon which meat was roasted over the fire. It was explained that, over the many years this kitchen was in regular use, it was remarkable that the building had never caught fire!

We thanked our hosts and split up to get lunch in one of the lovely cafes around the city centre and then reconvened to be divided into two groups and given guided walking tours around the city centre by local guides Maureen and Chris Poulton. Our very knowledgeable guides gave us some great insights into the history of the city and the walks were much appreciated by our party. We were also impressed with what a vibrant and busy city centre York has, with barely an empty shop to be seen anywhere. Our party expressed our warm thanks to our hosts for the day, offered to host a visit to our own town for any who wished to visit and boarded our coach which delivered us back at The Meres by 6pm, thanks to some skilful route planning by our driver.

General feedback indicated that the whole day had been much enjoyed by our party.




