

5 Simple Shifts That Help Church Visitors Stay Connected

Helping People Move from Attending to Belonging

“Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together... but encouraging one another.” Hebrews 10:24–25

Small, intentional connection practices help people feel seen, encouraged, and connected.

SHIFT #1 · Understand Why People Drift

People rarely disengage suddenly. Common reasons include:

- ✓ Missing a week and feeling unnoticed
- ✓ Lack of personal connection
- ✓ Unclear next steps for involvement
- ✓ Feeling anonymous in a large environment
- ✓ Life transitions and busy schedules

▶ *People stay where they feel known.*

SHIFT #2 · Gentle Follow-Up Communicates Care

Follow-up is not about pressure — it is about pastoral care. Simple practices:

- ✓ Send a welcome message after a visit
- ✓ Check in if someone is absent for several weeks
- ✓ Offer prayer and support
- ✓ Acknowledge milestones and life events

Example check-in message:

“We missed seeing you recently and wanted you to know you’re in our prayers.”

▶ *People return where they feel noticed.*

SHIFT #3 · Make Returning Easy with Service Reminders

Life gets busy. Gentle reminders help people stay connected. Helpful reminders include:

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- ✓ Weekend service times
- ✓ Sermon series topics
- ✓ Children/youth programming info
- ✓ Special services or events

 **Tip:** Send reminders on Friday or Saturday for best response.

► *Reminders remove friction and increase attendance.*

SHIFT #4 · Strengthen Community Connection

People stay when they belong. Encourage connection through:

- ✓ Small groups
- ✓ Ministry teams
- ✓ Fellowship gatherings
- ✓ Newcomer meals or coffee

 **Best practice:** Personally invite new attendees into community spaces.

► *Belonging leads to lasting engagement.*

SHIFT #5 · Create Clear Next Steps Toward Belonging

Many attendees want to connect but don't know how. Provide simple next steps:

- ✓ Newcomer gatherings
- ✓ Small group sign-ups
- ✓ Volunteer opportunities
- ✓ Discipleship pathways

"What is the next simple step we can offer someone this week?"

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► *Clear next steps help people move from attending to belonging.*

A Simple Weekly Rhythm for Connection

DAY	CONNECTION FOCUS
Sunday	Warm welcome and connection
Monday	Visitor follow-up
Midweek	Encouragement or devotion
Friday / Saturday	Service reminder
Ongoing	Prayer and pastoral care

Pastoral Encouragement

Healthy engagement is not built through programs alone. It grows through:

✓ Intentional care	✓ Consistent encouragement
✓ Authentic community	✓ Faithful shepherding
