A Few Words From Fr. Dariusz.....



On this 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we pick up Matthew's narrative with Jesus' discourse to His apostles concerning their mission. They are to proclaim what Jesus proclaimed: "The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand." They are to do

what Jesus did: "cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. "He tells His apostles that their mission was to be directed "to the lost sheep of the house of Israel".

The Gospel of Matthew is distinctive for its practice of citing the Old Testament in connection with Jesus' activity and teaching. The Gospel is also known for a structured presentation of Jesus' doctrine in the form of sermons or discourses. Each discourse is followed by collections of miracle accounts and incidents which reflect Jesus' doctrinal teaching.

Jesus wants to restore God's flock and give them guiding shepherds. He does so by choosing the "twelve." The twelve apostles were appointed and instructed so that the people of God would be renewed and shepherded. Jesus sends out His disciples as laborers to bring in the abundant harvest of God's restored people. Matthew also provides us with his list of the names of the twelve disciples, as do

Mark and Luke. In Matthew's Gospel those twelve disciples are also called the apostles. The word *apostle* means "one who is sent." The apostles are sent by Jesus to proclaim the kingdom of heaven in word and deed.

As Jesus sent his disciples to continue his work and mission, so too the Church which is us are sent by Jesus to proclaim God's love. The Church guided by the Holy Spirit continues Jesus' presence on earth. Every member of the Church is sent by Jesus to contribute to this mission. So, we as members of the church are reminded again to continue His work on earth. Let us ask that the Holy Spirit will give us the vision to see how God is present in our lives and in our world. May we have the power to ask for God's healing, for the life of those who are dying, for freedom from demons, and be encourage to help the poor, lonely, and hungry. We are the disciples of the Lord that He sends out everyday to proclaim the love of God.

May God bless all of us.

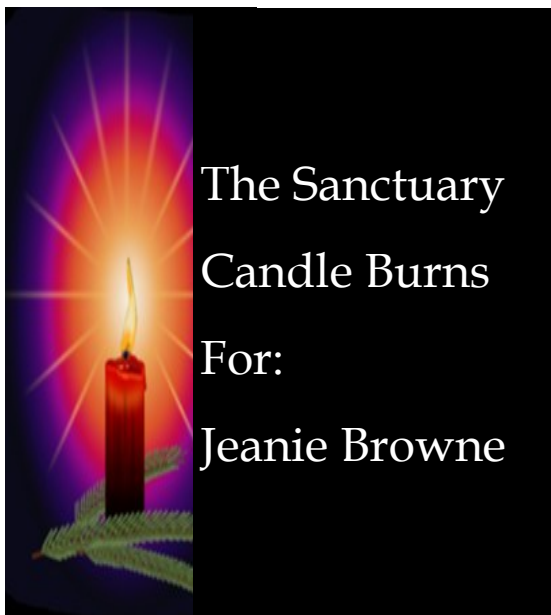

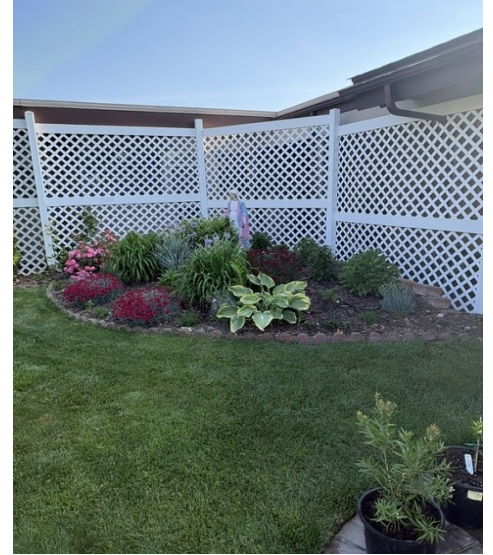
Our Prayer Garden

RISING FROM THE ASHES REVIVAL

A large-scale revival of faith centered in the Eucharist will take place July 22, 2026, along the banks of the Detroit River, where Detroit's faith story began nearly 325 years ago.

The Rising from the Ashes Revival will be a daylong event hosted at Huntington Place in downtown Detroit that will offer thousands of people an opportunity to grow, renew, and deepen their faith in Christ through the Holy Eucharist.

The event's schedule will include talks from speakers such as Bishop Daniel E. Flores, Fr. John Riccardo, Jeff Cavins, Sister Mary Grace, SV, and Chuck Galdica; music led by Matt Maher, Sarah Kroger, Steve Angrisano and Sarah Hart; and will culminate with a public procession with the Blessed Sacrament from Huntington Place to the Spirit of Detroit statue, and a blessing over the city and the Church of Detroit from Archbishop Edward J. Weisenburger.

Flag Day is celebrated in America on June 14, commemorating the day the first flag resolution was passed. On June 14, 1777, less than one year after Betsy Ross had received the order from General Washington to make the first flag, the Second Continental Congress passed a flag resolution stating: That the flag of the United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new Constellation. The first national observance of Flag Day was on June 14, 1877; 100 years after the flag resolution was adopted by the Continental Congress.
