A Few Words From Fr. Dariusz.....



I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate those children who made their 1st Communion Sunday and those who are making their First Communion this Sunday (not all of our children received Holy Communion at Cabrini). This sacrament brings a lot of joy to us to see those making their Communion and their guests at church when we all partake in

this special event. I wish you many of God’s blessing to you and your families. I would also like to thank those who prepared them for this special day, teachers, parents, and our Religious Department I am very proud of you that you have learned a lot about our Lord Jesus Christ. May the Lord be a guest in your hearts forever.

The Gospel Reading chosen for this Sunday takes us back to the Last Supper in the Upper Room where Jesus is gathered with his disciples to celebrate the Passover. Once again, we read one of the most beautiful, parts of John’s Gospel. Jesus is talking at the Last Supper, but John, who is recording it and who is also at the Last Supper, is recording it well, well after it happened.

Jesus knows that he is about to die. He also knows that he will be spending the night in agony in the garden and that he will be arrested and, the next day, he will be put on trial and he will be judged, not only by his own disciples, who all run away from him, but also, he will be judged by the leaders, the religious leaders of his day, and also by the Romans, the secular leaders of his day. And so, it’s a time when we can say this is his last words and testament. After this, and after his resurrection, it will be a different world.

We can imagine all the disciples, the poor apostles, sitting around, feeling quite sad. Jesus has just washed their feet. Washing the feet is a terrible

thing for them to see because it is the work of a slave, and the worst slave in the house is the only one who washes feet. So we have Jesus washing feet and then telling them that they must learn to wash feet and that God washes feet, that they should not be ashamed of it. What Jesus means is that everything that God makes is full of great dignity and honor. Now, the words of Jesus: “I only give you one commandment: Love one another in the same way that I have loved you.” That means you must learn to wash each other’s feet. His heart is full of sorrow because he is going to leave them and he is going to leave them in confusion. Only later, when He rises from the dead, will they begin to understand the total meaning of his coming, the incarnation of himself as man, taking on our life, taking on our difficulties as well as the wonders of being human beings. He turns to them saying: “Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have to have faith. You have to have faith and trust and love. In the same way, we too, have to have faith in God, we must trust in God and we must love God. We must have faith in God and trust Jesus, for Jesus and the Father are one”. Then Jesus says to Thomas the immortal words, “Thomas, I am the way, I am the truth and I am the life.

In the conclusion Jesus says to His disciples, “Amen, amen, I say to you, whosoever believes in me, trusts in me, gives himself to me, will do the works that I do: the healing and the caring and the reaching out and the loving of your fellow human beings.

I hope that seeing those little children making their Holy Communion reminds us that Jesus is always with us. Even though He went back to His Father, He is still with us. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, He promised dwells with in us to guide us. He is present among us when we do His work taking care of each and praising God for His love.
