A Few Words From Fr. Dariusz.....



I would like to take this opportunity to thank the garden committee for planting flowers around our property. You always do such a nice job. Also, I would like to thank those gentlemen who came to help with spreading the mulch. I greatly appreciate your hard work. I always hear many wonderful comments about the beauty of the flowerbeds and how beautifully everything is maintained. Once again thank you very much.

This weekend we are celebrating Pentecost Sunday. This feast commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, and takes its name from the fact that it comes nearly fifty days after Easter. It was a Jewish festival, and has been observed in the Christian Church since the days of the apostles. Today's three readings made reference to the arrival of the Holy Spirit, being baptized in the Spirit and being sent forth to proclaim the Word of God so others may convert to the living faith. The arrival of the Holy Spirit was affirmed in the First Reading when we read that, "All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages." Being baptized in the Spirit was affirmed in the Second Reading when it is said, "In the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body." And being sent to proclaim the Word of God was affirmed in the Gospel Reading when we read, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

"On the day of Pentecost when the seven weeks of Easter had come to an end, Christ's Passover was fulfilled in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, manifested, given, and communicated as a divine person: of his fullness, Christ, the Lord, poured out the Spirit in abundance." [Acts 2:33-36] When the work which the Father gave the Son to do on earth was accomplished, the Holy Spirit was sent on the day of Pentecost in order that he might continually sanctify the Church. Then the Church

was openly displayed to the crowds and the spread of the Gospel among the nations, through preaching, was begun. As the 'convocation' of all men for salvation, the Church in her very nature is missionary, sent by Christ to all the nations to make disciples of them.

The Church was made manifest to the world on the day of Pentecost by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. The gift of the Spirit ushers in a new era in the 'dispensation of the mystery' the age of the Church, during which Christ manifests, makes present, and communicates his work of salvation through the liturgy of his Church, 'until he comes.' In this age of the Church Christ now lives and acts in and with his Church, in a new way appropriate to this new age. He acts through the sacraments in what the common Tradition of the East and the West calls 'the sacramental economy'; this is the communication (or dispensation) of the fruits of Christ's Paschal mystery in the celebration of the Church's "sacramental" liturgy.

On Pentecost Sunday, the Church was born. The Holy Spirit united different people into the one Body of Christ. We, the members of the Body of Christ, benefit from our differences one from the other. May we allow the Holy Spirit to flow through our lives so that our respect for each other's uniqueness might itself draw more people to become members of the Body of Christ.

It is our tradition in AOD that on Pentecost Sunday new priests are ordained to serve us in our parishes. I would like to ask you to pray for those new priests who are ordained on the vigil of the Pentecost Sunday to serve God's people in the Archdiocese of Detroit. We want to congratulate them and wish them many blessings for God. At the same time, I encourage you to pray for new vocations to priesthood in the Archdiocese of Detroit.

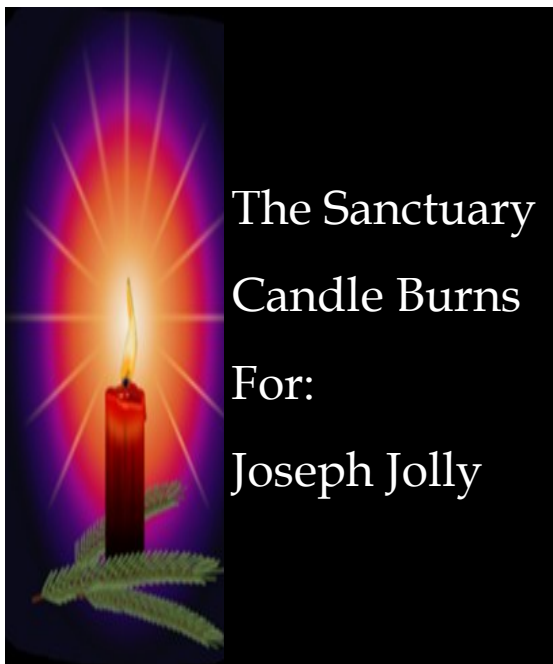

FOOD PANTRY Winter 2026 Meijer Results!

In the first 4 months of 2026 Our Ladies Food Pantry had 247 visits from needy families, averaging 15 per week. We provided 15,181 lbs of food, hygiene and cleaning items for 739 people at a cost of \$9,928. Your participation in the Meijer "Simply Give" Winter Campaign which ended Mar 31, 20206 resulted in \$3,050 of cards purchased, plus \$2,280 from Meijer's Double Match donation! This covered more than half the expense for this period!

Summer is approaching and children will be home from school. Travel or BBQ's may be on our minds, but many families are still struggling to keep food on their tables. When you shop and take advantage of the BOGO or "mult-purchase item discounts", please consider donating a few of these items. We currently need instant potatoes, pasta sides, peanut butter, jelly, tuna or can chicken, shampoo and bar soap.

Monetary donations are also gratefully accepted to purchase fresh goods like milk, eggs, meat, cheese and bread. We are happy to do the shopping for you. All donations should be brought to the Parish Office -weekdays 9:00-3:00(except Wednesdays). Checks should be made out to Our Lady of the Angels Food Pantry or consider donating one-time or monthly directly through our Church Website www.loacc.org. Select the Pantry fund using the Online Giving link.
