A Few Words From Fr. Dariusz.....



This weekend the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Holy Trinity. It is the greatest mystery of our faith.

Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and of Christian life.

God alone can make it known to us by revealing Himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Incarnation of God's Son reveals that God is the eternal Father and that the Son is consubstantial with the Father, which means that, in the Father and with the Father the Son is one and the same God. The mission of the Holy Spirit, sent by the Father in the name of the Son and by the Son "from the Father" reveals that, with them, the Spirit is one and the same God. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. The Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father as the first principle and, by the eternal gift of this to the Son, from the communion of both the Father and the Son.

By the grace of Baptism "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit", we are called to share in the life of the Blessed Trinity, here on earth in the obscurity of faith, and after death in eternal light. Now this is the Catholic faith: We worship one God in the Trinity and the Trinity in unity, without either confusing the persons or dividing the substance; for the person of the Father is one, the Son's is another, the Holy Spirit's another; but the Godhead of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit is one, their glory equal, their majesty coeternal. Inseparable in what they are, the divine persons are also inseparable in what they do. But within the single divine operation each shows forth what is proper to him in the Trinity, especially in the divine missions of the Son's Incarna-

tion and the gift of the Holy Spirit".

The feast of the Blessed Trinity was introduced in the ninth century and was only inserted in the general calendar of the Church in the fourteenth century by Pope John XXII. But the signs of religious beliefs and worship of the Trinity is, of course, to be found throughout the liturgy.

Why is this feast celebrated at this particular time? It may be interpreted as a finale to all the preceding feasts. All three Persons contributed to and shared in the work of redemption. The Father sent His Son to earth, for "God so loved the world as to give His only-begotten Son." The Father called us to the faith. The Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, became man and died for us. He redeemed us and made us children of God. He ever remains the liturgist *par excellence* to whom we are united in all sacred functions.

After Christ's ascension the Holy Spirit, however, became our Teacher, our Leader, our Guide, our Consoler.

The celebration of the Most Holy Trinity is a celebration of the Dignity we have received by being admitted into this Mystery. It is a blessing and gift from God. Whenever we gather to celebrate the Eucharist or celebrate any sacrament the Most Holy Trinity is present. Let us be filled with the blessing that comes from God the Father and His co-equal Son. Let us be open to the power of the Holy Spirit who sanctifies us.

May God bless all of us.

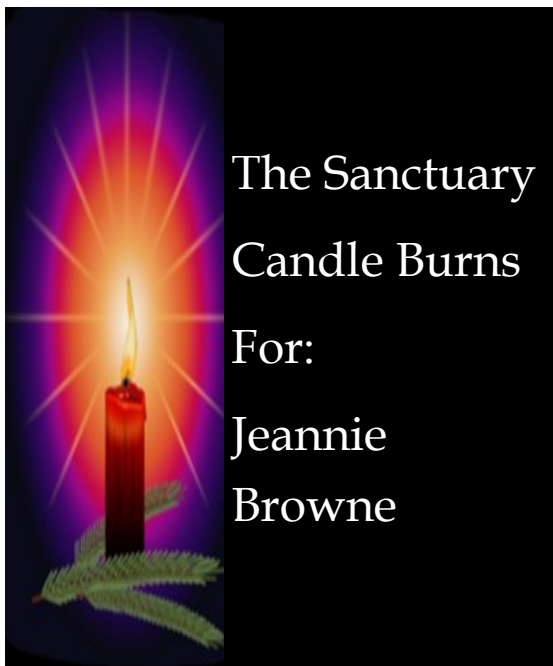
