A Few Words From Fr. Dariusz

A Few Words From Fr. Dariusz



This weekend in the church, we honor the Holy Family, Joseph, Mary, and their Son Jesus. On January 1st we honor Mary, the Mother of God.

The First Reading for the Holy Family celebration tells us a story about Hannah, the wife of Elkanah who was without child. She spent a lot of time praying to the Lord, asking for His blessing and promising in return to have her child serve the Lord. Her prayers were answered. God the Father agreed to Hannah's term and blessed her with a child. Hannah named her son "Samuel" which means "Name of God."

Hannah did not make the pilgrimage until her son was three years old. She may have avoided making the pilgrimage on this special occasion possibly out of a desire to prolong the time that she would keep her child.

Once the child reached the age of three, he was taken to the Temple where he was presented with a very respectable offering.

The Second Reading also speaks about children. There is a reference about us. We are called children of God. The reading reminds us of the great love that the Father has given us by giving us His only Son so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish but may have eternal life.

Today's Gospel Reading is a recollection of the event related Jesus in the Temple when he was a boy. The Jewish Law at that time required to make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem for three major feasts: Passover, Pentecost, and Tabernacles. This Law excused those who lived at a great distance; however, they were not excused for the Passover. When this event took place, Jesus was still a child according to the Law. He was a year before the

age at which a boy would officially reach manhood.

The Gospel also says that Jesus increased in wisdom. As a human being Jesus grew physically, intellectually, emotionally, and spiritually in preparation for the work that lay ahead of Him.

Mary, Mother of God

On January 1st we give honor to Mary to be the Mother of God. This Catholic Dogma finds its origin in a Bible passage that is found in the Gospel of Luke. After the archangel Gabriel had appeared to the Blessed Virgin Mary, she went to visit her cousin Elizabeth. Upon her arrival, Elizabeth said to Mary, "And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me?" Through Elizabeth who was full of the Holy Spirit, it was proclaimed that Mary was truly the Mother of God.

As Catholic we profess that in Jesus dwelled the Divine nature, the spiritual nature and the human nature. These three natures coexisted in the person of the Lord Jesus who was the Son of the Blessed Virgin Mary. While Mary did not give birth to the eternal Divine and spiritual natures of God, as the mother of One, she was the mother of all Three for these three natures are inseparable. As the soul, the spirit and the body of man cannot be separated in the fullness of a human being, the Divine Soul of God, His Holy Spirit, and His beloved Son Jesus Christ could not be separated to ensure that Jesus was truly God and truly man.

I know this statement can be a little confusing but it is the dogma of the church and we will never fully understand this feast.

With this spiritual confusion I wish you a Happy New Year.



FOOD PANTRY

Partners with Meijer in 2026

More and more members of our community are turning to Our Lady of the Angels food pantry for help with ensuring they know where their next meal will come from. In response Our Lady of the Angels pantry has again joined forces with Meijer SIMPLY GIVE HUNGER RELIEF program during this difficult time to help fill that void for our local families.

OLA Food Pantry has been selected to participate with Meijer on the upcoming campaign which begins DEC. 28th 2025 through Mar. 28th 2026, with DOUBLE MATCH DAYS at the TAYLOR MEIJER on Pardee on Sat. Mar 7th and Mar 21st 2026. The \$10 Donation cards are available at the Taylor Meijer as well as in the Narthex or Parish office. Please turn them in at the Meijer check-out any time you shop Dec. 28th-March 28th , 2026

Through Nov this year, our food pantry had 708 visits from needy families. We provide 2,114 people with a total of 41,300 lbs of food as well as hygiene, cleaning products and toiletries. Our numbers increased from an average of 14 per week in Jan-March to 20 families per week for Oct-Nov 2025.

With the help of the Meijer "SIMPLY GIVE" donation program, we were able to purchase \$15,157 of this food with gift cards purchased by our Parishioners at the Meijer in Taylor along with Meijer double match program. \$5,810 of these gifts were purchased during our last joint campaign which ended Mar 29th, 2025.

Thankyou to all of you who support the Pantry with food or monetary donations. We are very grateful for all your generosity. Your contributions have been a tremendous help keeping the pantry supplied so that we can continue to help those less fortunate than ourselves.
