In today's Gospel, Mathew encourages us to let our light shine before others, so that they may see our good works and give glory to your Father in heaven. We are the light of the Lord whenever we come together to celebrate the Eucharist.

In the First Reading Isaiah tells God's people that their actions will determine their glory or darkness. If we analyze some of the readings, we will find out that for some time, God had been telling His chosen people through Isaiah that He would send a Light in the world to save His people and the gentiles.

St. Luke tells us that our Savior Jesus, the Light of the world, fulfilled the promises of the Lord. Jesus said that the Spirit of the Lord is upon Him, because God has anointed Him to bring good news to the poor. God has sent Jesus to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor and whoever follows Him will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life.

Isaiah encouraged his people to share their bread with the hungry, to bring the homeless into their homes. They were asked to cover the naked and not to hide themselves from their relatives who may need their assistance.

Through those good works, the light of the people would break forth like the dawn. Sadness would turn to joy, their oppressors withdrawing before them and the glory of the Lord would be their rear guard, protecting them from unexpected hardships. When they share their food with the hungry and deliver justice to those who are afflicted, then their light shall rise in the darkness and their gloom will be like the noonday. Darkness will become light. Where there was despair, there will be hope. Where there was death, there shall be life. Where there was sorrow, there shall be joy.

Reviewing the Second Reading, when St. Paul went to preach to the Corinthians, it was to proclaim to them the mystery of Jesus Christ, He being crucified. Nothing else was on his mind. There was no intent to use lofty words or wisdom to deceive the Corinthians. Arrogance and procrastination were not part of his purpose.

Using a second example, Jesus said, "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." [Mt. 5:14- 6]

In life, we have two choices. In the likeness of Christ, we can shine as a light in the world or we could be rejected by God for failing to realize the ideal of the life of the Gospels. We cannot have both. We cannot serve two masters. We cannot gain the world and Heaven. The outcome of our eternal blessings entirely depends on the choice we make today, not tomorrow, because we might not be here tomorrow. No one knows when they will be called to appear before the Lord.

This week, let us take the opportunity to evaluate to what extent we are answering our calling, remembering the Sacred Words of Jesus, "Let your light shine before others." [Mt. 5:16]



FOOD PANTRY

Partners with Meijer in 2026

More and more members of our community are turning to Our Lady of the Angels food pantry for help with ensuring they know where their next meal will come from. In response Our Lady of the Angels pantry has again joined forces with Meijer SIMPLY GIVE HUNGER RELIEF program during this difficult time to help fill that void for our local families.

OLA Food Pantry has been selected to participate with Meijer on the upcoming campaign which begins DEC. 28th 2025 through Mar. 28th 2026, with DOUBLE MATCH DAYS at the TAYLOR MEIJER on Pardee on Sat. Mar 7th and Mar 21st 2026. The \$10 Donation cards are available at the Taylor Meijer as well as in the Narthex or Parish office. Please turn them in at the Meijer check-out any time you shop Dec. 28th-March 28th , 2026

Through Nov this year, our food pantry had 708 visits from needy families. We provide 2,114 people with a total of 41,300 lbs of food as well as hygiene, cleaning products and toiletries. Our numbers increased from an average of 14 per week in Jan-March to 20 families per week for Oct-Nov 2025.

With the help of the Meijer “SIMPLY GIVE” donation program, we were able to purchase \$15,157 of this food with gift cards purchased by our Parishioners at the Meijer in Taylor along with Meijer double match program. \$5,810 of these gifts were purchased during our last joint campaign which ended Mar 29th, 2025.

Thankyou to all of you who support the Pantry with food or monitory donations. We are very grateful for all your generosity. Your contributions have been a tremendous help keeping the pantry supplied so that we can continue to help those less fortunate than ourselves.
