A Few Words From Fr. Dariusz

A Few Words From Fr. Dariusz

Happy Wedding Anniversary Brothers and Sisters. Your anniversary is a wonderful testament to God's faithfulness and your commitment to one another, and may your marriage remain a strong example for us all. May God continue to shower you home with love, peace, and laughter, and may your marriage remain a strong example for us all. I use this passage for the Book of Numbers to bless you today. 'The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make His face shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.'

The theme of all three readings is that of God's mercy towards sinners.

The First Reading tells us that those who were chosen to worship God, the Creator, had betrayed him and worshiped an image of a calf. They also made sacrifices to a calf. God was very offended by this act of infidelity and was ready to destroy them. Moses pleaded with God and saved his people. When we read those passages from the Old Testament, we need to keep in mind that those people, Chosen People, were exposed to many statues and figures, even human beings who called themselves gods.

God's people wanted to be like the rest of the people. They wanted to worship God and see his image. For making an image of God they were punished. Even now, the Jewish religion does not allow any kind of images, statues or paintings representing God. I am sure you have witnessed several times during your lifetime, how many times other religions accuse us Roman Catholic's for worshipping images without understanding our faith, religion, and belief.

God's reaction seems to portray him as an angry jealous God, who will resort to the most terrible punishments when his law is disobeyed. That's not the message of the story. The message is that God pardons the sin of his people in response to the prayer of Moses.

While God has no second thought about separating Himself from sinners, in this case, it was because of the personal relationship that Moses enjoyed with God that the Lord showed mercy towards the people. This kind of personal relationship has been sought by many people. It is very personal and at the same time very rewarding.

In the days of the Old Testament, Moses, a sinner himself, mediated for the sinful people.

From the Second Reading we learn about God's mercy. St. Paul talks about how the mercy of God sanctified him because he had a sincerity of heart. By the mercy of God, Paul, formerly a blasphemer,

a persecutor, and a man of violence was made an example to those who would come to believe in Jesus for eternal life.

In his letter that we are going to read this Sunday St. Paul is expressing his gratefulness to Jesus for the call that he had received to preach the Gospel. He recognized that the grace of our Lord overflowed in him with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.

The Gospel Reading of Luke also speaks of the mercy of God. In this case, three parables are given to declare the magnitude of the mercy of God. These are the parables of the Lost Sheep, of the Lost Coin, and of the Prodigal Son. Each parable shows the joy of finding someone who was lost. The joy of becoming united with those who have waited for those who drifted away from the loving father is overflowing. There are many people who left the Lord for many reasons. As Christians we must pray for them to our loving Father to bring them back to us.

It does not matter how great a sinner might be, there is always time to turn back because Jesus came into the world to save all of us.


