A Few Words From Fr. Dariusz

I would like to congratulate those couples who celebrated their anniversaries with us last Sunday at 11:30 am Mass. As a Christian community we thank God for all His blessings He had showered you during those years. We also pray for you and ask God to bless you with His Grace.

In today's First Reading, prophet Amos speaks against greed. The Israelites were waiting impatiently for the end of the holy days and Sabbaths so that they could proceed with their dishonest practices. In this specific case, the feast of the new moon was taking place.

This celebration of the first day of the new moon, like the Sabbath, were days of rest. During these celebrations, without exception, no business was to be transacted.

Amos speaks about two abuses done by the Israelites. The first one was dishonesty during their trading. They used an ephah measure to cheat and oppress the poor. An ephah is a dry measure that is slightly greater than a bushel. The law forbade them to use dishonest means of measures. The dishonest Israelites were guilty of selling what should have been thrown away, such as the sweeping of the wheat, or they were mixing good and bad grain.

The second transgression was

that they were selling the righteous for silver, and the needy for a pair of sandals.

In the Second Reading, St. Paul to Timothy, we are reminded of our spiritual obligations in accordance with the universal salvation that the Heavenly Father planned for mankind.

St. Paul urges us that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgiving need to be made for everyone. He especially encourages us to pray for those in high positions.

St. Paul also reminds us that there is only one Mediator between God and men. It is Jesus Christ. He is able to represent us because He shared in our human nature through the incarnation.

Today's Gospel sounds puzzling to contemporary readers, but it can be made less so by considering the economic system which stands behind the parable. A steward is dismissed because he is squandering his master's property. He is called dishonest because he is not serving the interests of the rich man, his employer. In response the steward, in an attempt to ensure favor for himself among the rich man's debtors, brokers repayment of the rich man's loans by foregoing the interest and fees that had been levied to line the steward's pockets. It is this action, in which the steward puts aside his greed and takes the longer perspective in order to enhance his security, which is

commended by the rich man. The passage concludes with three morals for the listeners. The first exhorts the listener to be prudent about the use of wealth. Like the steward in the parable, those who would follow Jesus must put transitory affairs in proper perspective. Christians should handle the affairs of temporal life with an eye toward eternal life. The second concerns trustworthiness. Those who can be trusted in small things can also be trusted in great things. If Christians handle money and other passing things responsibly, then they can also be trusted with the affairs of the Kingdom of God. Finally, Jesus tells his listeners that no one can serve two masters simultaneously. God must be put ahead of money. In the Gospel Jesus invites us to make friends by means of worldly wealth. This requires one to perform acts of charity by helping the needy with physical items such as food, clothing and furniture. Those who have been helped will remember their donors and keep them in their prayers.
