## A Few Words From Fr. Dariusz

This weekend we begin a new liturgical year. This new liturgical year begins with the First Sunday of Advent. The liturgy invites us to come to the house of God, so that God may teach us His ways and help us to walk in His light.

During this time of Advent, we are encouraged to be prepared for the coming of the Lord.

We can prepare ourselves for the coming of the Lord Jesus in three ways:

- (1) Firstly, we are preparing ourselves for the coming of the Lord as the Judge, either at death or at the end of this world, whichever may come first.
- (2) Secondly, we are preparing ourselves to receive the physical presence of our Redeemer through the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.
- (3) Thirdly, we are preparing ourselves for the coming of Christmas, the birthday anniversary of the Lord's coming into this world as God incarnate.

After saying that, we know that the main goal of Advent is to prepare ourselves for the celebration of Christmas. However, to understand Christmas we have to start at the beginning with the history of salvation.

God's plan of salvation is centered in Christ and realized through Him. Advent looks back at the promise of His first coming, when that plan was announced and it looks forward to His second coming, when that plan will reach its complete fulfillment. It also celebrates His actual coming in time.

The First Reading of this Advent Sunday from Isaiah is concerned with the Messiah and the messianic times. Isaiah kept the hopes of the people alive in very dark times. In today's reading we

have the theme of universal peace and salvation. He said that Through Jerusalem, salvation came to the world. Through Jerusalem came the meaning of true love. Through Jerusalem came the fulfillment of everlasting justice and peace of the Kingdom of God. Consequently, we can now truly say, let us walk in the light of the Lord! Isaiah prophecy was a prophecy of the incarnation of the Lord God through Jesus Christ.

In the Second Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans reminds us that salvation is nearer to us now. No matter how we look at it, each day is a day closer to the day when we will come face to face with the Lord Jesus. This encounter may involve the return of Christ to judge the world and to gather His elect for their final reward, or it may involve the day when our souls will suddenly be called to depart from this world. St. Paul reminds us of that fact through his words. "You know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near.

The Gospel and the Second Reading deal with the Lord's second coming, which that first Christians believed was imminent. Both readings convey a sense of urgency through phrases such as, 'Wake up', and 'Stand ready'.

The Gospel Reading tells us to be awake because we do not know on what day your Lord is coming. In the midst of violence, suffering, injustice, persecution, indifference, Jesus, the messenger of peace, tells us to be vigilant.

I hope during this busy time of advent and Christmas preparations we will find time take our time to spend some time on prayer.

May God bless all of us.
