

## **OUR FAITH EXPLAINED!**

## **Question:**

Why does the priest wear red sometimes?

#### **Answer:**


FAITH

In the liturgy, colors are not just decoration; they carry meaning and help us enter more deeply

into the mysteries we celebrate. **Red is the color of blood and fire.**On the feast of a martyr, it reminds us of the courage and sacrifice of those who gave their lives for Christ. Their blood is a witness (martyr means "witness") to the truth of the Gospel, and red also symbolizes the Holy Spirit, who strengthens all Christians to follow Christ faithfully.

This week, for example, we celebrate St. Callistus on October 14, St. Ignatius of Antioch on October 17, and St. Luke on October 18. Seeing the priest vested in red invites us to remember the witness of these saints and to ask the Holy Spirit to help us live our faith boldly. Red connects heaven and earth: their heroic witness inspires us, and the Spirit empowers us to follow Christ with courage and love. It also reminds us that holiness often requires sacrifice and perseverance, and that we are called to bear witness to the Gospel in our daily lives, even in small acts of faithfulness and charity.

Red is also a call to reflection: it reminds us that our faith is not always comfortable or easy. We are invited to embrace the cross in our own lives, to stand firm in truth, and to show love for God and neighbor even when it is difficult. In this way, the liturgical color becomes a living symbol, helping us unite our prayers, struggles, and joys with those of the saints and martyrs who have gone before us, drawing us closer to Christ and His Church.



## **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

This Sunday, we hear the story of ten lepers who call out to Jesus from a distance: "Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!" In His compassion, Jesus sends them to the priests, and as they go, they are made clean. It is a beautiful act of healing and restoration. What happens next is even more revealing as only one of the ten returns to thank Jesus. He throws himself at the Lord's feet, praising Him. And that one is a Samaritan—a foreigner and outsider. The one person that was least expected to come back.

Jesus asks, "Were not all ten made clean? Where are the other nine?" It's a question that makes us ponder today. We see that gratitude is more than a "thank you." It is a response that comes from a heart that recognizes God as the source of our healing, our blessings, our life. The Samaritan did more than acknowledge the gift—he went back and gave him thanks. In doing so, he found something greater than physical healing. He encountered true salvation in the Lord as the Lord responds, "Your faith has saved you,"

How often do we receive without returning? How many graces have passed through our lives unnoticed or unacknowledged? In our busy world, it is easy to forget, to move on quickly, and to assume that what we have is simply what we are owed. But faith calls us to remember, to return, and to have faith.

This week, let us take the time to reflect on where we have experienced God's mercy. Return to the Lord in prayer, speak your thanks out loud, and return to His feet. Live your gratitude through acts of kindness and generosity with Him in the center of it all.

## OCTOBER 12 READINGS: TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

<u>First reading:</u> 2 Kings 5:14-17: "I will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any other god except to the Lord."

Responsorial: Psalm 98: "The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power."
Second reading: 2 Timothy 2:8-13: "If we have died with him, we shall also live with him."
Gospel: Luke 17:11-19: "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."



Let's continue our journey through the saints of October—a month filled with beautiful feast days that draw us closer to Christ. The Church places before us holy men and women whose lives reveal different paths of prayer, love, and trust in God. This week, we look to three saints who show us what it means to live with hearts fully alive in Christ.



## St Carlo Acutis: October 12

Carlo Acutis, often called a "millennial saint," shows that holiness is possible in ordinary life. His spirituality was anchored in the Eucharist—he called it his "highway to heaven."

Carlo teaches us that the sacraments are not just rituals but encounters with the living God. His joy, simplicity, and love for technology in service of the Gospel remind us that sainthood is not about escaping the modern world but transforming it with the light of Christ

### St. Teresa of Ávila-October 15

Teresa, Doctor of the church, invites us into the deep life of prayer. For her, prayer is not lofty words or abstract thought, but a relationship—true friendship with Jesus. She described the soul as an "interior castle," where God Himself dwells, and she encouraged us to journey inward with humility and perseverance. Teresa reminds us that holiness grows when we learn to sit in silence with Christ, to listen to His voice, and to allow His love to transform us from within.



## St. Margaret Mary Alacoque: October 16

She points us to the Sacred Heart of Jesus—the heart that burns with love for every soul. Through her spirituality, we learn that Christ's love is not distant but personal, tender, and merciful.

The devotion to the Sacred Heart calls us to trust His goodness, to console His heart through acts of love and reparation, and to spread His compassion to others. Margaret Mary teaches us that the heart of Christ is a refuge of peace, especially when we are burdened or wearv.

As we reflect on the spirituality of St. Teresa of Ávila, St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, and Saint Carlo Acutis, let us confidently ask for their intercession this week. May Teresa guide us deeper into prayer, Margaret Mary teach us to trust in the loving Heart of Jesus, and Carlo inspire us to live our faith joyfully each day. May their example lead us closer to Christ, helping us love more fully and serve more faithfully. St. Carlo, St. Teresa and St Margaret, pray for us.



## A HAPPY MOUTH IS A HAPPY MIND AND BODY

That is the theme to Dental Hygiene Awareness Month – a time to raise awareness of the overall importance of good oral health. Poor oral hygiene can lead to a negative quality of life due to limited food choices, stress, anxiety and decreased socialization. However, a healthy mouth can contribute to positive mental well-being because it can boost self-esteem and confidence. Therefore, caring for your teeth and gums can significantly improve your overall happiness.

Fresh breath, strong teeth, and healthy gums are essential for good oral health so consider the "daily 4 – brush, floss, rinse, and chew". It is recommended, on a daily basis, to at least brush twice, floss once, rinse

with mouthwash, and even chew sugar-free gum after meals to remove any fragments of food left behind when brushing is not an option.

And don't forget regular oral check-ups with dental professionals. Because the mouth and body are closely interconnected, tooth decay and gum disease can lead to other, more serious health issues such as heart disease and serious infections. Therefore, maintaining oral health is important for overall physical health too.

So, what is the goal of good oral hygiene? To make everyone smile—inside and out!
