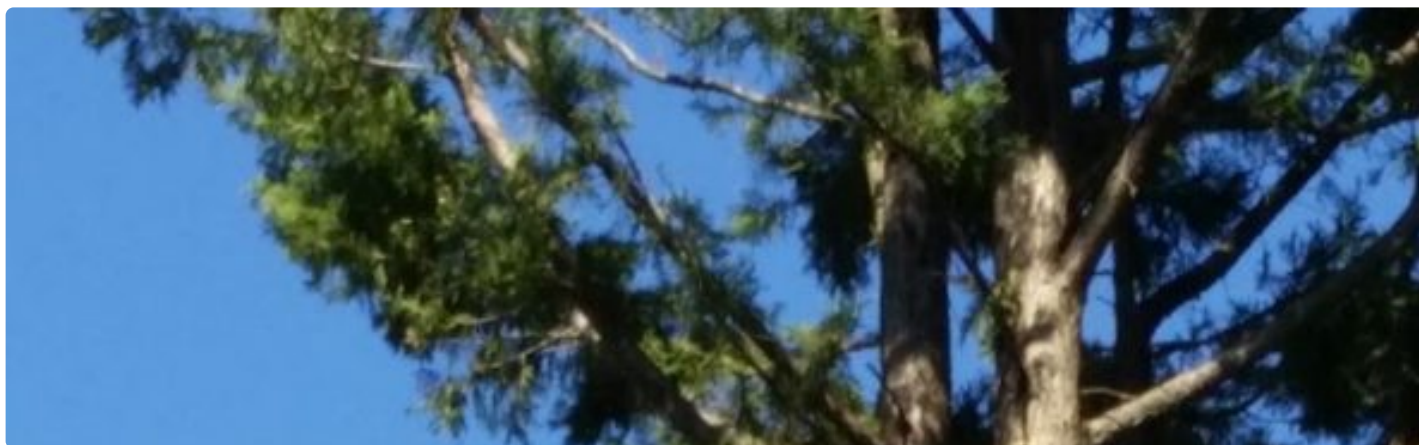


GETTING AHEAD OF THE SEASON

Ahead of the Storm: Why Trimming Season Starts Now

Late-summer storm activity in Central Maryland doesn't wait for a convenient time on the calendar. Fast-moving afternoon thunderstorms and high-wind events can turn an overgrown canopy into a serious liability in minutes. Homeowners who schedule tree trimming now — before storm activity peaks — are the ones whose trees are ready for it.



Certified Arborist Evaluation

Strategic Trimming Reduces Wind Load

A dense, overgrown canopy catches wind like a sail. Professional tree trimming opens the canopy so high winds pass through safely instead of tearing branches loose or uprooting the tree entirely.

Not every tree can be saved with trimming alone. When a certified arborist identifies advanced decay, severe lean, or root damage, tree removal services protect the rest of the property before that tree becomes the storm's first casualty.

Beyond the Surface: Tree Health Evaluations Before Fall

A tree can look perfectly healthy from the driveway and still be under serious stress. Late summer heat, drought stretches, and a full season of storms take a cumulative toll that's often invisible without a trained eye. A tree health evaluation now catches problems while there's still time to act before fall.



✓ Heat Stress Signals

Scorched leaf edges, early leaf drop, and thinning canopy are common signs of heat stress that homeowners often mistake for normal seasonal change. Left unaddressed, a heat-stressed tree becomes far more vulnerable to disease and structural failure.

✓ Structural Risk Assessment

A tree risk assessment looks at what the eye can't easily catch — included bark, co-dominant stems, root plate movement, and other structural weak points that turn into hazards during the next big wind event.
