


EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT




Greetings, and welcome to the 2022 Annual Report for Love's Arm Outreach. This year we were able to reflect on lessons learned during the pandemic. Most notable was the increased attrition in our residential program and the remarkable increase in the number of encounters in our street and motel outreaches. We also launched an Acute Care program that allows us to better serve the short-term needs of those in immediate crisis. We are excited to expand this service in 2023.

This report highlights each of our programs and provides a snapshot of the financial contributions that allow us to provide services. Our IRS form 990 provides more detail and can be provided upon request. In addition to the data, you will see a tribute to our founder, Mimi NIkkel, who will be retiring in March 2023.



STEWARDSHIP



Love's Arm is committed to a high standard of financial transparency and accountability in stewardship. In 2022, sixty-seven percent of our support was received from individual donors and local church missions support, with thirty-three percent coming from family and community foundation grants. Our desire is to increase individual and local church mission support to seventy-five percent. We welcome accountability and will make our financial reports available upon request. Our annual 990 can be viewed on Guidestar, and we are listed as a charity in good standing with the organizations listed below. Our Board of Directors examines our financials every other month to ensure accountability and good stewardship of the resources with which we have been blessed.










RAHAB'S REST

Below is a list of the many activities and classes that Chrissie oversees as part of the healing process.



STREET OUTREACH




JAIL CLASSES & READY WRITERS




A little known fact is that the idea to start Love's Arm came to our founder after a Bible study with women in the local detention center.




HELPLINE




