As part of **National Safe Work Month**, ADG will deliver a series of safety-focused activities across its work sites. These include:

- Airport Safety Week (13–15 October): Foreign Object Debris (FOD) Walks: engaging staff, airlines, and community leaders in hands-on airfield safety practices
- Staff Workshops & Toolbox Talks: promoting the importance of a strong safety culture day-to-day and when responding to emergency situations.
- **Emergency Preparedness:** emergency response planning, first responder training and cyclone season briefing.
- Community Engagement Activities: highlighting the importance of a safety-first culture beyond the airport fence.

According to Safe Work Australia, 200 workers were killed at worksites in Australia. This year's National Safe Work Month campaign reminds us to not be complacent by emphasising the importance of assessing and controlling risks to help prevent fatalities, serious injuries, and illnesses, ensuring every worker returns home safely.

National Safe Work Month also serves as a timely reminder for organisations to review and strengthen their workplace health and safety policies and processes.
