

Two doses are best!

Measles Mumps Rubella Vaccine

Protects your child from a serious contagious illness.

Help keeps school and social activities safe.

Builds stronger protection for life.

Did you know that full protection against measles requires two doses of the MMR (measles, mumps, and rubella) vaccine?

The first dose gives important protection and is given between 12-15 months of age. The second dose ensures your child is fully covered, keeping them safe from measles outbreaks, and is given between 4-6 years of age.

If your child isn't fully vaccinated, especially with measles cases on the rise, now is the time! Protecting your child helps protect our whole community.

Why the 2nd dose matters:

If your child is insured, please make an appointment with your primary care provider for vaccinations.

About the Vaccines for Children Program:



If your child is eligible for the Vaccines for Children Program (VFC), you can visit the Public Health Division for vaccinations. If necessary, fees may be waived.



ELIGIBILITY: Children through 18 years of age are eligible if they are:

- Medicaid eligible
 Medicaid enrolled
- American Indian or Alaska Native
