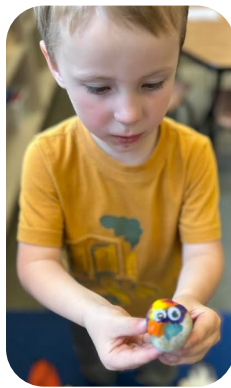


Mass Server Training

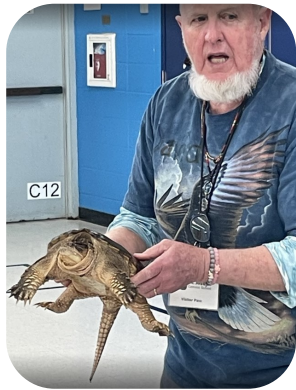


3K - The 3K students read the story “Not Norman” and then did a fish art project. For “Pet Week” they made pet rocks.

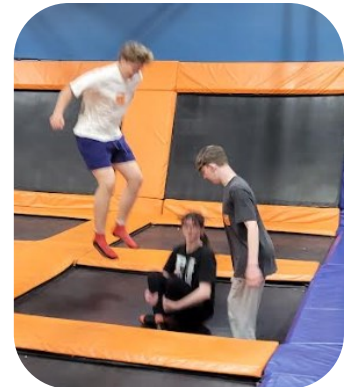
8th Grade
