PURPOSE

Prayer walking isn't one-size-fits-all. There are multiple ways to pray for our neighbors, for specific streets, for Northwest Arkansas, and for the world. The Spirit prompts each of us differently, and that's why it's important for us all to be sold out on praying for Every Street. And the objective is simple. . .

PRAY *for others.*

WALK *their streets.*

REACH *the lost.*

For some of you, prayer walking may be a new idea, and you may wonder where to begin. This guide is designed to help you take those first steps, but ultimately, allow the Holy Spirit to lead your prayers. When you're unsure how to pray, start with Scripture. **Jesus Himself gave us a model for prayer:**

*"Pray, then, in this way:
'Our Father who is in heaven,
Hallowed be Your name.
'Your kingdom come.
Your will be done,
On earth as it is in heaven.
'Give us this day
our daily bread.*

*'And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors.
'And do not lead us into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For Yours is the kingdom
and the power
and the glory forever.
Amen.'"*

NOT WALKING?

That's okay.

Not everyone has the physical ability to prayer walk, but that doesn't make your role in Every Street any less important! The Lord hears your prayers whether you're walking, running, sitting, or lying down (Ps. 139:7-12). We want to encourage you to pray in a different physical way— by tapping into your

senses. The Lord designed us to use sight, taste, hearing, smell, and touch, and those can all be used for prayer. If you're praying from home, consider sitting close to an open window, sitting on your porch, or simply becoming more aware of what's happening around you. Use your senses for prayer!





WHO DO YOU SEE?

Neighbors going to work?

Pray for them, their families, provision, and peace.

WHAT CAN YOU HEAR?

Kids laughing in the yard?

Pray for joyful childhoods and hearts that will one day follow Christ.

WHAT CAN YOU SMELL?

A grill fired up for the family next door?

Pray for marriages, relationships, and meaningful conversations around the table.

WHAT CAN YOU FEEL?

Sunshine beaming on your shoulders?

Pray for those living in spiritual darkness to experience the light of Christ.

WHAT CAN YOU TASTE?

Is God prompting you to bake a treat?

Pray for opportunities to show hospitality through baked goods to neighbors.

TAKE IT TO THE STREETS

Some of you will prayer walk alone. Others will talk with family, friends, or your LIFE Group. Remember, there's no "right way" to go about this! The goal is simply to pray intentionally for the people God has placed around us.

Approach God with gratitude. "By prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." Phil. 4:6-7

Align your heart. Set your mind on Christ and remove any distractions that may hinder you.

Ask God for His agenda. Pray with open hands. Ask God to burden your heart for specific people and places.

Respond in obedience. If God impresses someone or something upon your heart, pray specifically and be willing to act.

Trust God's work. Remember God is always working, even when you cannot see it.

READY FOR MORE?

Go door-to-door.

Some of you may feel led to take an additional step and engage neighbors in conversation through door-to-door evangelism. If so, be mindful of neighborhood guidelines and personal safety.

God's Word reminds us to be ready to always give an account for the hope within us. Door-to-door evangelism is a great opportunity to put that into practice!

Report your street. As prayer reports come in, you'll be able to see prayer pins in real time across Northwest Arkansas and beyond.

Celebrate God's work. Did you have a meaningful conversation? Did someone ask for prayer? Did you have an opportunity to share the Gospel? We want to celebrate what God is doing through His people.

ACTS 1:8

“But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth.”

THE PROOF OF PRAYER.

All throughout Scripture, we see countless examples of God answering the prayers of faithful people:

Elijah prayed God would send fire to consume his offering.
1 Kings 18

Jonah prayed for deliverance from the belly of the fish.
Jonah 2

Paul and Silas prayed and sang hymns to God while in chains.
Acts 16:25

When God answered each of these prayers, His name was glorified and people came to know Him:

The prophets of Baal who challenged Elijah turned from their false god and praised the one true God.

The entire city of Ninevah where Jonah was sent repented in sackcloth and ashes.

An earthquake shook the prison where Paul and Silas were captive, and when the jailer saw that they had stayed of their own accord, he asked them what he must do to be saved.

"Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us, to Him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations forever and ever. Amen."
