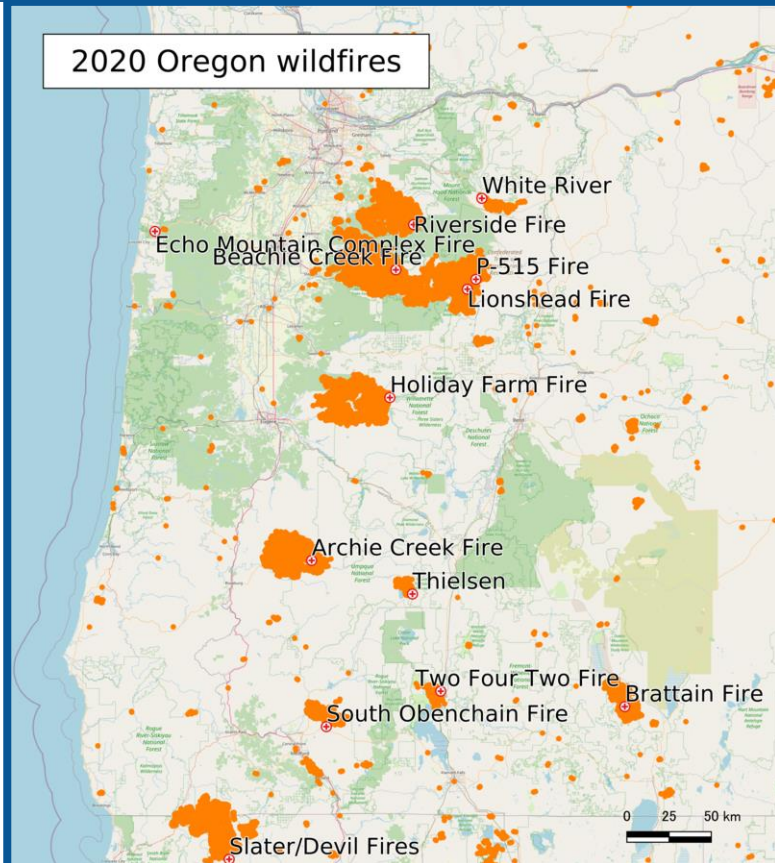

Elliott State Forest, South Slough Reserve closed due to extreme fire danger

Effective immediately, the Elliott State Forest and South Slough National Estuarine Research Reserve are closed to the public due to extreme fire danger.

The Oregon Department of State Lands today enacted the closures as a public safety measure.

The National Weather Service has issued a Red Flag Warning for southwest Oregon indicating critical fire conditions. Strong, gusty winds with low humidity and high fire danger can cause significant spread of new and existing fires.

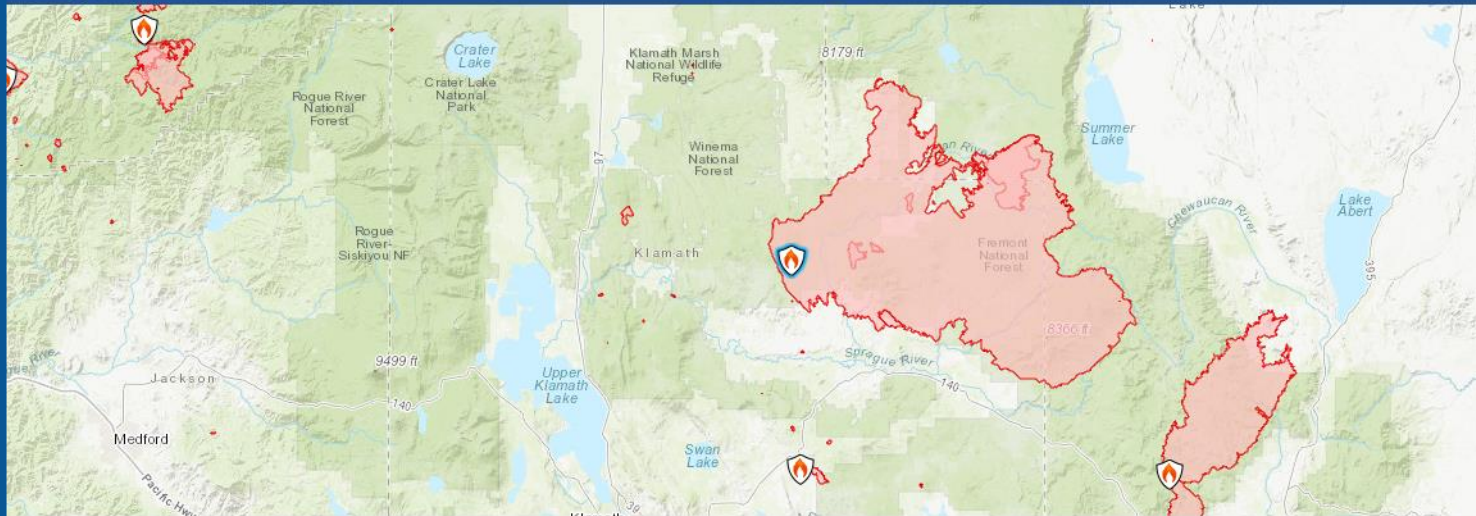

Wildlife and habitat are abundant on most state-owned lands.

Help Protect State Lands

- Take your trash. Pack it in, pack it out.
- Prevent fires. No open fires are allowed throughout the year.
- Respect other visitors and the land. Obey all Oregon laws and common rules of decency.
- Leave the site as you found it. Do no damage to natural resources or built structures.

About Oregon's School Lands

Congress admitted Oregon to the Union in 1859, granting nearly 3.4 million acres of the new state's land "for the use of schools." The State Land Board was established to oversee these "school lands" and has been the trustee of the Common School Fund for more than 150 years.

Today, the Oregon Department of State Lands manages approximately 780,000 acres of land, including the South Redmond Tract, to generate money for the Common School Fund. In 2018, the fund distributed \$57.6 million to Oregon's K-12 school districts, including \$1.76 million to Bend-La Pine Schools.

The 945-acre South Redmond Tract is owned by the people of Oregon and managed to help fund our K-12 public schools. This land is open daily for recreational uses, including:

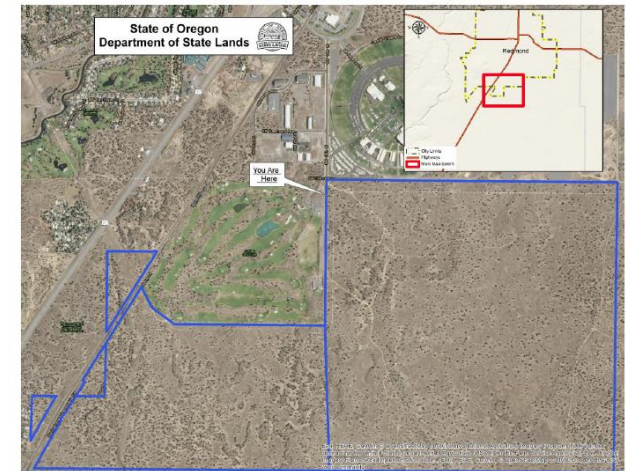
- Photography

The South Redmond Tract and other state lands are managed for the people of the state to help fund Oregon K-12 schools. Restrictions on this tract include:

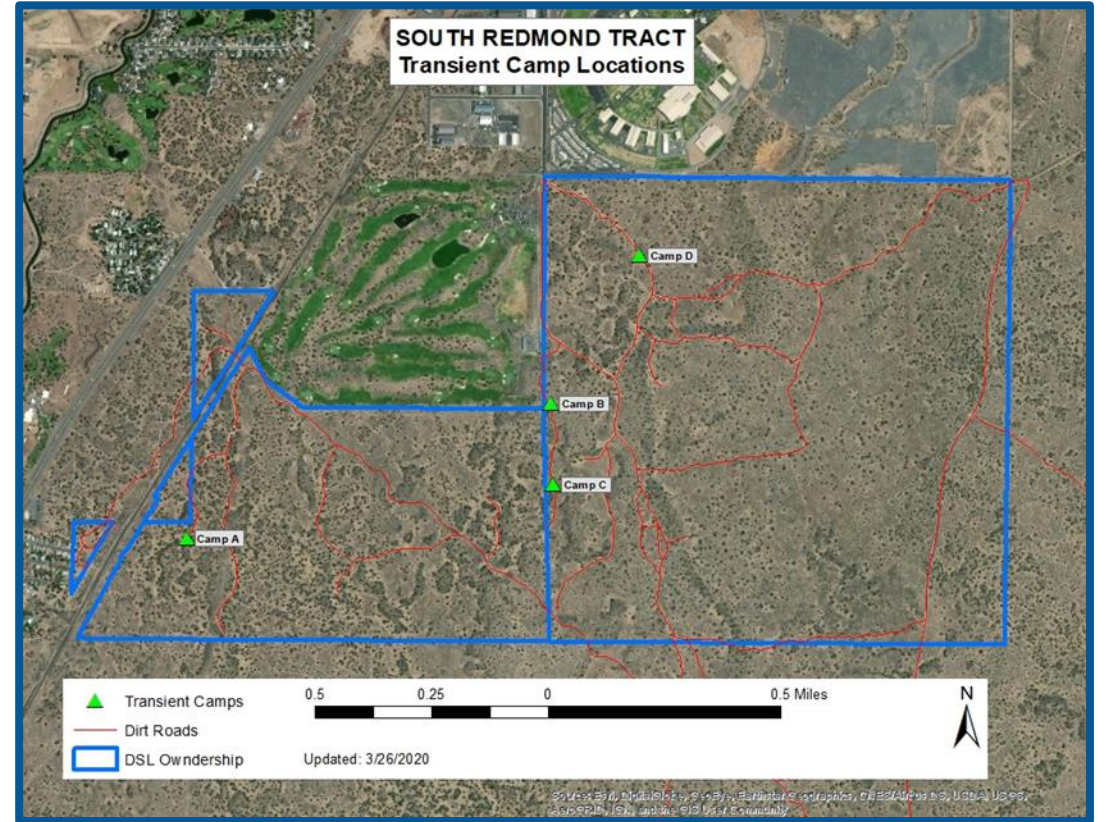
- Overnight use

- Drug and alcohol use
- Damaging natural resources or property

Violators are subject to citation for criminal trespass and other penalties allowed by law.

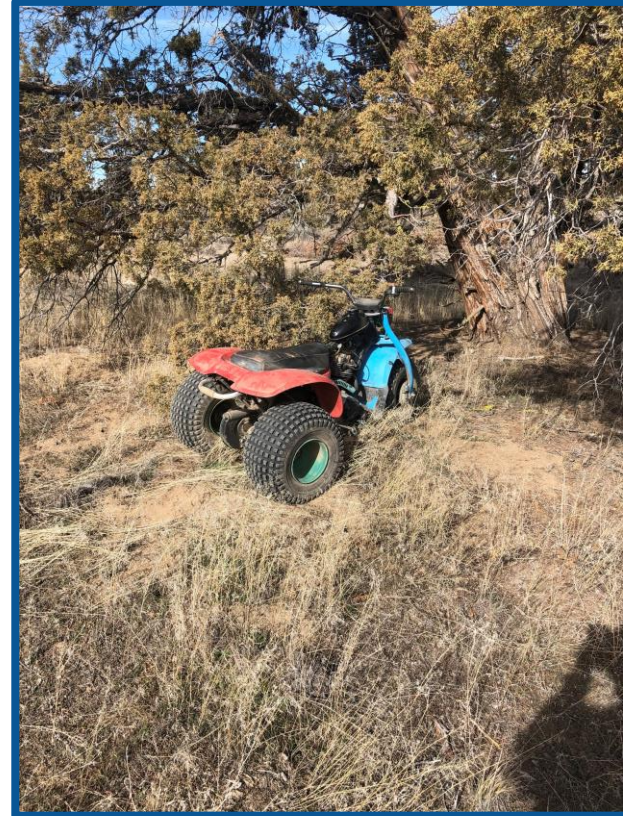
