March 31, 2023: Governor Little signed into law H267, creating the Idaho Career Ready Students (ICRS) Program.

August 1, 2023: first meeting of the Idaho Career Ready Students Council, 2 proposals awarded

Sept. 6, 2023 – Feb. 16, 2024: Council meets three times, 56 proposals awarded

July 1, 2024: Idaho Legislature appropriates an additional \$20M

August 13, 2024: Council meets, 14 proposals awarded

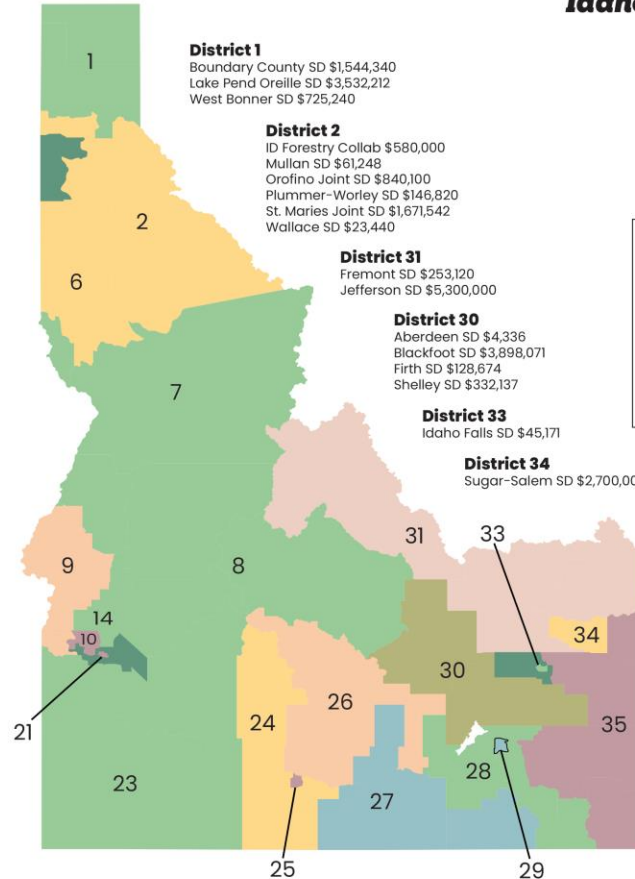
