

Registered parishioners are asked to make arrangements for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults: This process for becoming Catholic is a series of steps conducted in the context of learning about the faith and spiritual formation, through which a person is fully incorporated in the Body of Christ, the Church. This formation is for the unbaptized, those baptized in other Christian communities, and Catholics who have not received all three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist).

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated every Saturday from 3:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m., during a Communal Penance Service during Advent and Lent *or by appointment*.

Holy Orders: When a gentleman feels the call to follow the Lord as a Priest in the Catholic Church, he should call Father Philip Smith, our Diocesan Vocation Director, at 419-244-6711 or speak to one of the Parish Priests. If the Permanent Diaconate is of interest to a gentleman, he should call Deacon Daniel Brahier, our Delegate for Deacons, at 419-244-6711 or speak to one of the Deacons of the Parish.

Religious Life: Consecrated women and men religious by their lives witness the joy of eternal union with God. Freed from earthly cares, they more fully manifest the Kingdom of God to all Christians. The structure of the vowed life frees consecrated religious to live entirely for God and others. If you are interested in this vocation, you can contact Sister Maria Amata, RSM, at

Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the Parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a Priest or Deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office to arrange for Holy Communion at home. When a parishioner is in a hospital or nursing home, please call the Parish Office to arrange for a visit. You may wish to call before any planned surgeries. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick by calling the Parish Office at 419-885-5791. Please call, do not email in urgent situations.




Liturgy Screen Projection Ministry–Volunteers Needed

The Holy Family is celebrated on the Sunday following Christmas. The Holy Family serves as a model for all families. This feast honors their lives together, beginning in Bethlehem and then moving to Nazareth, Egypt and back to Nazareth. The feast recognizes the humility of Jesus, Mary's virtue and Joseph's steadfastness, along with the obedience of all three to God's plan for them in salvation history.

MARY, THE MOTHER OF GOD



January 1

We close out the Christmas octave—the eight days following the birth of Christ-with a day honoring Mary as the Mother of God. This holiday is a celebration of Mary's motherhood of Jesus. It is a reminder of the role she played in the salvation of humankind.

The title "Mother of God" is a western derivation from the Greek Theotokos, which means "God-bearer". Mary being chosen by God, the Father, to bring Jesus Christ into this world, and her willingness to do so is a great cause for celebration. The honoring of Mary as the Mother of God can be traced back to the Council of Ephesus in 431.

New Years Day is a great time to make a resolution to get to know Jesus' mother better. How can your family do that?

Pray together

Most years, January 1 is a Holy Day of Obligation. In 2022, the Solemnity falls on a Saturday, so it's <u>not</u> a holy day of obligation. It's still a wonderful chance to go to Mass, though. It's also a perfect opportunity to pray the Hail Mary slowly and intentionally.

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Listen for the words, "Mother of God."

Work together

- Create a Marian Altar in your home. It's simple:
- Select a location. Where in your home do you want the altar to be?
- Find a surface. It could be a small table or a shelf.
- Add religious items. A Marian altar should include an image of the Blessed Virgin Mary. That could be as simple as a holy card or as ornate as a beautiful statue.

That's all you need! From there, you can get as creative as you wish.

Explore together

Find a statue of Mary in your church. Make a special visit (this can be right after Mass).

STEWARDSHIP: Christian stewards are disciples of Jesus Christ who receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord. All the ministries related to the stewardship of God's gifts to His people are included in this category.

Year-End Giving

Many of you evaluate your financial resources this time of year and make decisions regarding charitable contributions. Please consider Saint Joseph Parish as you make plans for charitable giving this season.

Parish Operating Fund

Your contributions to this fund help to pay for our everyday operational expenses such as utilities, lawn care service and snow removal, cleaning and maintenance, salaries, benefits, etc., which allow us to continue our parish mission of reaching out in service to all.

Saint Joseph Parish School Endowment Fund

Your contributions to this fund will support our school long-term. Your gift to this fund is an investment tool that provides for the financial security of the school. Parishioners, alumni, and friends donate financial gifts to the fund. The funds are pooled together and invested. Annually, a portion of the earnings are returned to the parish/school for tuition assistance. The principal and remaining interest stay in the fund and grow with returns on investments.

<u>Rainy Day Fund</u>

Your contributions to this fund will be used for future capital improvement needs, such as unexpected and unbudgeted building repairs and other needs of the parish.

IRA Charitable Giving Opportunity

If you have reached the age of 70 1/2, you are eligible for what the IRS has deemed a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). A QCD allows you to give directly from your IRA to a qualifying charity, such as Saint Joseph Parish, and the distribution is not counted as taxable income to you. If you are also required to take an annual Required Minimum Distribution (age 73 and older), a QCD can count toward this minimum. We recommend that you consult with your investment advisor and/or tax advisor if you have questions!

Giving Appreciated Securities

Many people who own appreciated investment securities want to use these as a way of making charitable donations. The tax benefit can be twofold: 1) The value of your donation may be tax-deductible; 2) No capital gain taxes will be due on the increase in value over your cost basis. If you would like to make a donation to Saint Joseph Parish using appreciated securities, please notify our Business Manager, Heather Koziarski at 419-885-5791 (ext. 228) (hkoziarski@stjoesylvania.org) and she can provide instructions for donating stock or mutual funds to Saint Joseph Parish.

<u>Sign up for Online Giving</u>

You can choose to do a *One-time Gift* or a special remembrance, or you can set up regularly scheduled contributions that are withdrawn on the date you specify in the system. 
