



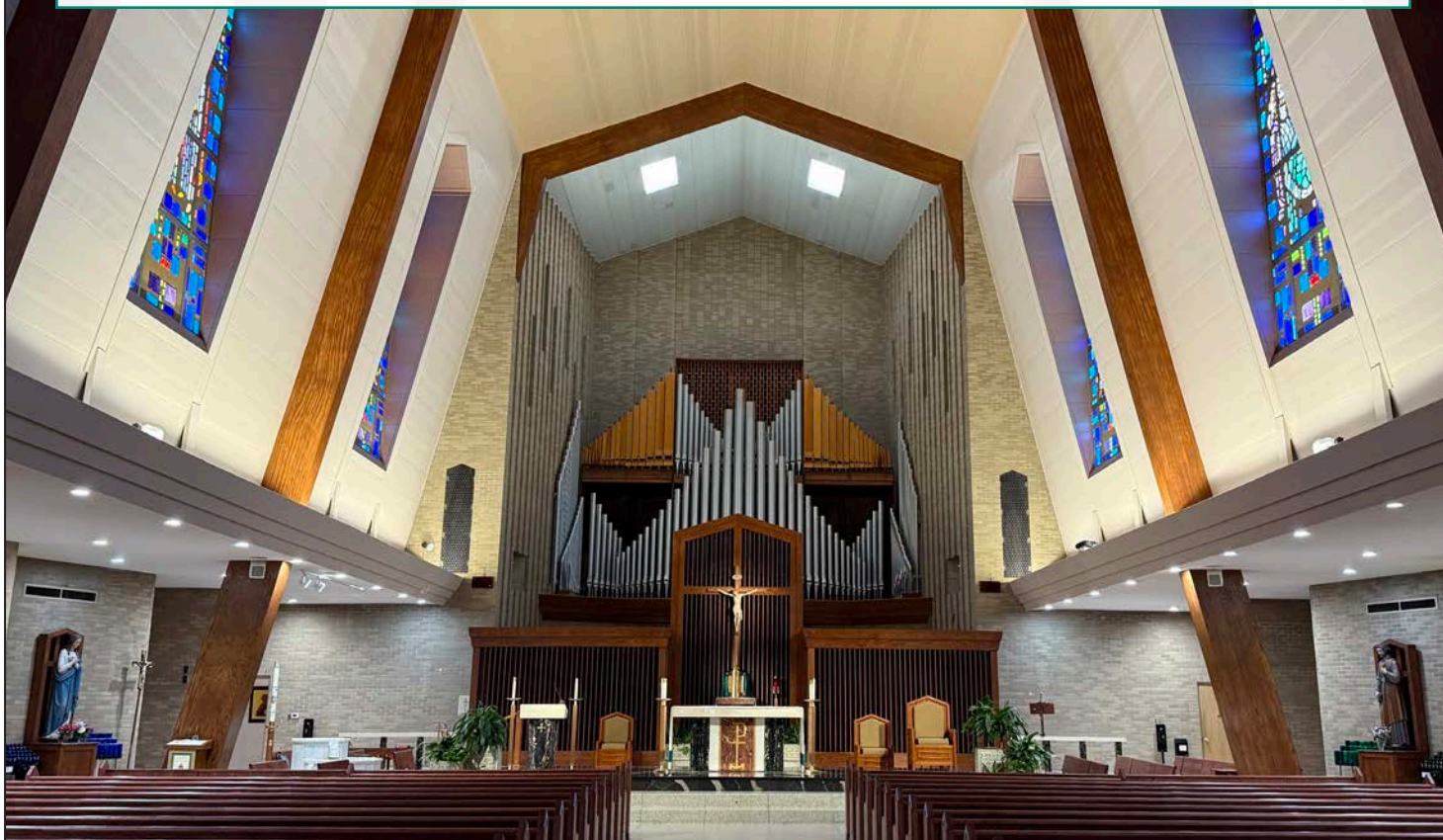

Infant Baptism: The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated after the Noon Mass on the Second and Fourth Sundays of the month. Registered parishioners are asked to make arrangements for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA): This process for becoming Catholic is a series of steps conducted in the context of learning about the faith and spiritual formation, through which a person is fully incorporated in the Body of Christ, the Church. This formation is for the unbaptized, those baptized in other Christian communities, and Catholics who have not received all three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist).

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated every Saturday from 3:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m., during a Communal Penance Service during Advent and Lent *or by appointment*.

Holy Orders: When a gentleman feels the call to follow the Lord as a Priest in the Catholic Church, he should call Father David Kidd, our Diocesan Vocation Director, at 419-244-6711 or email: dkidd@toledodiocese.org, or speak to one of the Parish Priests. If the Permanent Diaconate is of interest to a gentleman, he should call Deacon Daniel Brahier, our Delegate for Deacons, at 419-244-6711 or speak to one of the Deacons of the Parish.
Religious Life: Consecrated women and men religious by their lives witness the joy of eternal union with God. Freed from earthly cares, they more fully manifest the Kingdom of God to all Christians. The structure of the vowed life frees consecrated religious to live entirely for God and others. Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the Parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a Priest or Deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office to arrange for Holy Communion at home. When a parishioner is in a hospital or nursing home, please call the Parish Office to arrange for a visit. You may wish to call before any planned surgeries. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick by calling the Parish Office at 419-885-5791. Please call, do not email in urgent situations.

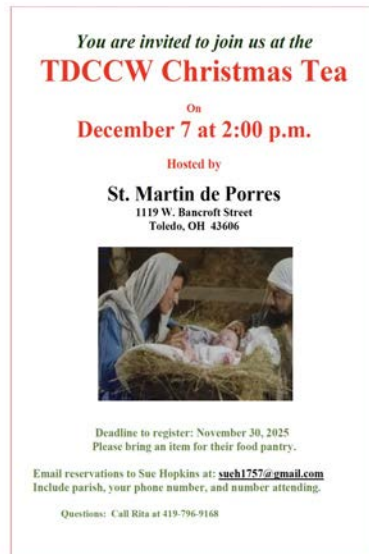

A Note About the Notes--Today we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. This basilica is considered the Mother Church of all churches. I love the double-meaning of temple/church in our readings and throughout our theology. "Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? ...for the temple of God, which you are, is holy" (1 Corinthians 3:16-17). So, yes, we honor a building, but more than that we honor the people of God, the Church. Our hymn to accompany the preparation of the gifts today comes from a Music Director in a Detroit suburb, Zach Stachowski. The refrain makes mention of this double meaning: "Bless these walls, bless this space; find in us a holy place." This song was also used to bless and re-dedicate our choir area (behind the screen) when we made renovations a few years ago. No matter what improvements we make to our church building, what makes it a church is the people of God that it serves. "Make us new, one in you, gathered here to grow in faith."

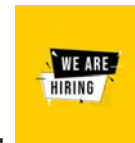

The Anointing of the Sick

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is a vital part of Catholic pastoral care, offering spiritual strength, peace, and courage to those facing serious illness or the frailty of old age. This document explains when the sacrament may be received, its repetition, and practical guidance for the faithful.

Appropriate Timing for the Sacrament

The Anointing of the Sick is not administered on a fixed schedule. It is received when a person's health places them in genuine danger of death or when a serious illness worsens. The Church teaches that each serious illness, significant deterioration, or new grave sickness may warrant receiving the sacrament. It may be repeated as circumstances require.

The sacrament may be administered as soon as a faithful person begins to be in danger of death due to sickness or old age. The Catechism states that each time a Christian falls seriously ill, they may receive the Anointing of the Sick. The Second Vatican Council emphasizes that the appropriate time is when the danger of death first appears—not only at the moment of imminent death.

Possibility of Repetition

If the illness worsens, the sacrament can be celebrated again during the same episode. Canon 1004 allows repetition if the sick person, having recovered, becomes gravely ill again or if the condition becomes more serious during the same illness. The Compendium of the Catechism confirms that the faithful may receive it several times if their illness worsens or another serious sickness occurs. Pope Saint Paul VI's *Sacram Unctionem Infirmorum* adds that repetition is appropriate if the person recovers and then falls ill again, or if the danger becomes more acute.

No Periodic Requirement

Because the sacrament is linked to the individual's health condition, the Church does not prescribe a regular interval such as annually or monthly. It is given when the sick person is fully conscious or, if necessary, when the person has lost consciousness but would have requested it while competent. The faithful are encouraged not to wait until the point of death to request the sacrament, but to seek it as soon as the danger arises.

Practical Guidance

A person should request the Anointing of the Sick in the following situations:

- A serious illness is diagnosed that threatens life.
- The illness worsens or new complications appear.
- After recovery, the person falls ill again.
- Advanced age brings grave weakening that places the person in danger of death.

Thus, the frequency of receiving the sacrament is determined by the individual's health circumstances, not by a predetermined calendar.
