

Registered parishioners are asked to make arrangements for the Baptismal Preparation Class and the Liturgical Celebration by calling the Parish Office.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA): This process for becoming Catholic is a series of steps conducted in the context of learning about the faith and spiritual formation, through which a person is fully incorporated in the Body of Christ, the Church. This formation is for the unbaptized, those baptized in other Christian communities, and Catholics who have not received all three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist).

Penance: The Sacrament of Penance is celebrated every Saturday from 3:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m., during a Communal Penance Service during Advent and Lent *or by appointment*.

Holy Orders: When a gentleman feels the call to follow the Lord as a Priest in the Catholic Church, he should call Father David Kidd, our Diocesan Vocation Director, at 419-244-6711 or email: <u>dkidd@toledodiocese.org</u>, or speak to one of the Parish Priests. If the Permanent Diaconate is of interest to a gentleman, he should call Deacon Daniel Brahier, our Delegate for Deacons, at 419-244-6711 or speak to one of the Deacons of the Parish.

Religious Life: Consecrated women and men religious by their lives witness the joy of eternal union with God. Freed from earthly cares, they more fully manifest the Kingdom of God to all Christians. Matrimony: Anyone planning to be married must contact the Parish at least six months in advance. The exact date and time of your wedding should not be determined until after consultation with a Priest or Deacon. If either party has previously been civilly or religiously married, the Presider is not permitted to set a date for the wedding without resolving the previous marriage.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: When a parishioner is confined to home because of age or infirmity, please call the Parish Office to arrange for Holy Communion at home. When a parishioner is in a hospital or nursing home, please call the Parish Office to arrange for a visit. You may wish to call before any planned surgeries. When one is seriously ill, the healing Presence of the Lord should be requested in the Sacrament of the Sick by calling the Parish Office at 419-885-5791. Please call, do not email in urgent situations.

A Note about the Notes

Our Communion hymn today draws from many parts of Scripture, encompassing many facets of our faith but most particularly why we gather together for liturgy. "Taste and see the grace eternal. Taste and see that God is good." While not explicitly about the Eucharist, this hymn draws us closer to the presence of God – the goodness that never fails – the grace eternal.



These words were written by Canadian, Sylvia Dunstan, who attributed her love of song to her grandparents, and has written many hymn texts establishing faith as essential to life. This tune was written by Bob Moore who has published over 300 choral and instrumental works. What I love about this song is that driving nature of the refrain – almost like a mantra: taste and see, taste and see, taste and see. How could we not consume the Eucharist and see how amazing our God is? Taste and see, taste and see. How could we not consume the Eucharist and see the evidence of God everywhere we go? Taste and see.
