Examination of Conscience. If you are anything like me, when it comes time to do your examination of conscience for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, it doesn't take long to get bored looking at the same exam and coming up with the same sins (most of the time). One way we can open our eyes and minds to other aspects

of our lives is by using different forms of examinations. I will briefly offer five ways for us to examine ourselves in preparation for the sacrament outside of the standard of the Ten Commandments (the commandments are the standard because they are excellent preparation). All of these will require a bit of research on your part before your examination can begin. I think it is important that when we examine our conscience we acknowledge both the times we did well, and times we came up short because while it is important to recognize our shortcomings it is also good to acknowledge when we have done God's will, the examine is not a blood bath of our wretchedness.

The first method would be to use the Virtues. The Theological Virtues of faith, hope, and charity, as well as the Cardinal Virtues of prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance. Assess how the Virtues play into our lives and then determine where you have done well and where you've come up short. The Vices are another method of examination. The seven Vices are pride, avarice, envy, wrath, lust, gluttony, and sloth. This obviously is a similar method to the Virtues, but from the opposite perspective. For every Virtue, there is a corresponding Vice. Assess how well you have avoided the Vices and when you have fallen into them. The third method would be to use the Beatitudes in relation to the Spiritual and Corporal works of Mercy. There is not enough space in this column to go over the Beatitudes or the Works of Mercy, so make that part of your research before your examination. Again, review the areas where you have done well and where you have fallen short. Another method is to think of your five senses of sight, hearing, touch, taste, and smell. This gets tricky, but keep in mind, are we using our senses for our own gratification or the building up of God's Kingdom? Lastly, and this is an additional piece to all of the previous methods. Go back through the words of the Confiteor we say at Mass on Sunday, and in particular the words, *in what I have done and what I have failed to do.* A person who can see their failures in what they have not done, in my opinion, is further up the spiritual ladder than most of us.
