
Our 3rd annual 'Advent by Candlelight'

On Our Journey

The Numbers 6 & 7 — God created man and the beasts on the sixth day and rested on the seventh. What is some of the significance of that?

While man was created on the sixth day, God wants us to freely enter into the seventh day. Typologically speaking, the number six stands for wickedness, imperfection, or deficiency. This shows up in some of the Old Testament stories. In the story of David and Goliath, Goliath is 6 cubits tall. In the Book of Daniel, the wicked king makes a statue of himself that is 60 cubits high, and even King Solomon, in his greed, taxed the Jewish people and made 666 talents of gold out of what he collected. The more sixes, the more problematic the person or situation is. The number of the beast, 666, in the Book of Revelation, refers to the Emperor Nero or Caesar Nero, as the letters in his name add up to 666 in the Greek Numerals system. The early Christians would have made that connection after Nero had Saints Peter and Paul killed, as well as thousands of other early Christians.

The number seven, on the other hand, is a holy number. To the Hebrew people, the seventh day was the entrance into the Covenant with God; they would literally "seven themselves" in their covenant relationship. Again, typologically speaking, the number seven means covenant, or completeness, perfection, holiness. Like the Jewish people, the seventh day is important to Catholics as well. While the Hebrew "day of rest" is Saturday, ours is Sunday, in accord with the Resurrection of our Lord. On Sunday, we enter into "His rest" as we come together to worship the Creator of all things. We need to leave the "beasts" of the sixth day behind and enter into the peace of our Lord's Day.
