

Epiphany Blessing, Explained

The Epiphany household blessing is a centuries-old tradition that invokes God's blessing on all who enter one's home.

All you need for an Epiphany blessing is chalk, which is usually made available by parishes either on the feast of the Epiphany or in the weeks leading up to it. There are a few different formulas for blessings out there, but the essence of the ritual is always the same: a priest or the head of the household calls down God's blessing on the house and everyone who comes into it, and an inscription is made above the door in chalk.

The inscription reads: **the first two digits of the year + C + M + B + the last two digits of the year.** The initials C, M and B represent the names of the magi — Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar — and also signify the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless the house."

On Our Journey

The Scandal of Christ. We have just finished celebrating the birth of our Lord and are now enjoying the season of Christmastide. In this short article, I will revisit scripture stories we know well, but juxtaposed against the backdrop of our modern culture and “sensibilities,” they would seem to be great stumbling blocks to following Jesus.

His entry into the world was facilitated by a 14-year-old girl who carried him and who was betrothed but not married, and she’s a virgin! And the father is not human but a Spirit, the holiest of all spirits. The Savior of the world was brought into the world surrounded by a group of animals next to a haystack, and his family raised him in poverty. He lived the vast majority of his life in obscurity, working manual labor in a little northern town, a distant outpost of the epicenter of Rome, the power in the world, and far from the leaders of his own people.

When he arrived on the scene, this poor carpenter from Nazareth, at the age of 30, practically unknown to the world, claimed to be God. If you decided you wanted to be one of his followers, you would be doing that with the dregs of society, sinners of all kinds. You’d also attract all of the town’s sick and maimed who followed him seeking to be healed. He also wants you to sell everything you own and give to the poor, which you have just become. He also commands you, if you are going to follow him, that you have to eat his body and drink his blood. If you still think it’s a good idea to follow this guy, he also wants you to deny yourself, pick up your cross, and follow him to a much bigger, heavier cross that leads to great pain and suffering for him and his followers. He tells you he must die this brutal death on that cross to save the souls of all mankind. He will then rise from the dead and, for his last earthly act, ascend himself into the sky so high he will be out of sight.



