The Thought That Makes Time Holy

A Reflection inspired by Fulton J. Sheen's with Wisdom from 'Go To Heaven' (1960)

"It is never true to say that we have no time to meditate; the less one thinks of God, the less time there will always be for God... Thinking determines the uses of time; time does not rule over thinking... It does not require much time to make us saints; it requires only much love."

—Fulton J. Sheen

We live in an age of acceleration. Notifications, deadlines, and digital noise have convinced us that time is our master. But Sheen reminds us: time is not the tyrant. Thought is. And behind thought, love.

The Lie of "No Time"

When we say, "I don't have time to pray," we're not describing a shortage—we're revealing a priority. Sheen's insight cuts through the fog: "The time we have for anything depends on how much we value it."

Time is elastic. It stretches toward what we love. We find time for entertainment because we value escape. We find time for work because we value income. But do we find time for God? For silence? For soul? The problem of spirituality, Sheen says, is not time — it is thought. And thought is shaped by love.

Thought as Stewardship

Thinking is not passive. It is a form of stewardship. What we dwell on, we become. What we prioritize in thought, we pursue in time. Sheen's brilliance lies in this reversal: "Time does not rule over thinking."

This means:

- We are not victims of the clock—we are authors of our attention.
- We are not enslaved by schedules—we are shaped by what we choose to contemplate.
- We do not need more hours—we need more love.

Sanctity Is Not a Schedule

Sheen's final line is a balm to the weary: "It does not require much time to make us saints; it requires only much love." This is not romanticism—it is realism. Saints are not made by calendars. They are made by commitment.

- A mother's whispered prayer while folding laundry
- A student's silent gratitude before an exam
- A worker's moment of surrender before the shift begins

These are not interruptions. They are sanctifications.

A Call to Our Readers

Let us not measure our spiritual lives by minutes, but by meaning. Let us not wait for silence to be scheduled—let us create it. Let us not ask for more time—let us ask for more love. Because in the end, it is not time that makes us holy. It is the thought that leads to love. And the love that leads to God.
