Today's Gospel shows that none of us have any excuse for not following Jesus. No illness or inability is an obstacle to His grace when He chooses us to carry out His plans. At times, as we see in the Apostles, the Lord will make use of our skills for the benefit of His kingdom—if we are fishers, we will be made fishers of men.

In the 300s, Bishop Eusebius of Caesarea wrote about the beauty of this encounter in his Proof of the Gospel. In it, he tells us to “reflect on the nature and grandeur of a Being who could associate with Himself poor men of the lowly fisherman's class, and use them as agents in carrying through a work that transcends all reason. For having conceived the [plan] ... of spreading His own laws and a new teaching among all nations..., He thought good to use the most rustic and common men as ministers of His own design.... For how could [they] teach, even if they were appointed teachers to only one person, far less to a multitude of men? How should they instruct the people, who were themselves without any education? But this was surely the ... divine will and of the divine power working in them. ... And when He had thus acquired them as His followers, He breathed into them His divine power, He filled them with strength and bravery” (Book III, Chap. 7).

Be encouraged, then, that nothing can keep us from taking part in the call that God puts upon each of our hearts. He will not send us out on a mission without first giving us the tools, weapons, or graces to carry out such plans, for He is always faithful and eternally gracious to His children.
