#### **ROOM BY ROOM ACTIONS**

#### **Entryway & Living Room**

- Donate or sell unused décor, framed art, or ornaments
- Recycle batteries, cords, light globes
- Offer vintage items to op shops or collectors
- Post furniture or electronics to Buy
  Nothing if in good condition
- Sort family photo frames: keep, digitise, or pass to relatives

#### Tips:

Consider sharing sentimental items with siblings or extended family.

Create a "memory box" of small mementos before downsizing large pieces.

#### Kitchen

- Compost expired food
- Onate unopened pantry items
- Recycle jars, containers, soft plastics
- Drop off cleaning bottles, coffee pods and packaging
- Rehome cookware or crockery

#### Tips:

Turn tea towels into rags; offer spare cutlery to community kitchens.

Elderly estates may have vintage kitchenware – these items can often find a second life through online collector communities, or platforms like eBay.

#### **MINDFULNESS**

- Pause with Purpose: Take a photo.
   Tell the story behind an item.
- Memory, Not Excess: Keep only what holds meaning.
- Family-Friendly Framing: "We're passing this on to someone who needs it now."
- Sadness and Thanks Can Sit
   Together: You're doing something deeply human.

#### **HANDY RESOURCES**

**Kitchen Warehouse:** Offers The Great Pan Exchange, a national recycling program for old pots, pans, and baking trays. Drop cookware made from iron, steel, aluminium, copper, or non-stick into in-store bins

<u>Coffee Pod Recycling:</u> Download a free shipping label and send in your aluminium coffee capsules to TerraCycle for free recycling.

**Givit**: Accepts good-quality furniture, whitegoods, and household items. Your donation helps people doing it tough.

<u>Foodbank Donations:</u> Find where to drop off unopened pantry items near you.

#### **ROOM BY ROOM ACTIONS**

#### **Bedrooms & Wardrobes**

- Sort into: Keep / Donate / Sell / Textile recycle.
- Send worn clothing, socks, or underwear to Upparel, Sheridan Recycling Program, Dressed for Success, or H&M Garment Collecting.
- Rehome quality clothes via op shops or women's shelters.
- Offer vintage or sentimental clothing to family before donating.
- Recycle shoes or accessories through specialty programs.

#### Tips:

- Heirloom items (like wedding dresses, military jackets) can be framed, stored properly, or passed on thoughtfully.
- Create a shared album or photo collection of special outfits before letting go.

#### **Bathroom**

- Recycle oral care items (toothbrushes, floss, razors)
- Donate unopened soaps, toiletries, or incontinence products
- Upcycle worn towels into pet bedding or rags.
- Safely dispose of expired medicines

#### **MINDFULNESS**

- Create a Memory Box: For small, meaningful items.
- Photograph Special Items: If you can't keep it, capture it.
- Involve Family: Especially children or siblings in decisions.

#### **HANDY RESOURCES**

- <u>Upparel:</u> Recycles worn clothing not fit for donation.
- Sheridan Recycling Program: Drop off old towels and sheets in store
- <u>Dressed for Success</u>: Donate professional clothing to support women entering the workforce.
- H&M Garment Collection: Accepts all textiles for recycling.
- Find an Op Shop: Search for charity shops to donate quality used goods.
- Shoe Donation (Save Our Soles):
   Recycles sports shoes
- <u>TerraCycle:</u> Offers free recycling programs for tricky items like oral care
- Share the Dignity: Donate hygiene products for women and girls in need.
- <u>Expired Medicines:</u> Return unwanted medicines to any pharmacy for safe disposal.

#### **ROOM BY ROOM ACTIONS**

#### **Kids' Rooms or Hobby Spaces**

- Rehome toys, puzzles, and books to daycares, libraries, or charities.
- Donate or repurpose craft supplies, wrapping paper, jars, buttons, etc.
   Offer collections (sewing, stamps, trains) to community groups or Facebook collectors.
- Connect with local parents to sell or gift school uniforms on Facebook

#### Tips:

Give children a say in the process — frame it as sharing joy with others.

Honour a loved one's hobbies by giving supplies to others who will use them.

#### **Home Office & Paperwork**

- Shred and recycle unnecessary documents.
- Digitise important photos or letters.
- Recycle ink cartridges, pens, and old tech, including cords and cables
- Rehome stationery or art supplies.
- Create a folder of essential records (birth/marriage certs, medical notes).
- Donate working laptops, phones, and tablets

#### Tips:

Estate decluttering often brings up legal or financial papers — keep a clear system.

Reach out to relatives before discarding letters, journals, or old notebooks.

#### **MINDFULNESS**

- Take It Slow: Tackle one small, manageable task at a time.
- Done Is Better Than Perfect:
   Progress matters more than perfection.
- Be Kind to Yourself: This can be emotional—go gently.

#### **HANDY RESOURCES**

- Banish BRAD: Recycles over 150
  hard-to-recycle items including
  beauty, cleaning, tech, and packaging
  waste.
- The Reconnect Project: Refurbishes donated phones, tablets, and laptops for people experiencing disadvantage.
- Reverse Garbage: Accepts clean, reusable materials like textiles, timber, plastics, and craft supplies for creative reuse.
- The Sewing Basket: Accepts
   donated fabric, haberdashery, and
   yarn to support disability employment
   services.
- Officeworks Recycling: Drop off pens, batteries, and printer cartridges for recycling at selected stores.

#### **ROOM BY ROOM ACTIONS**

#### **Garage, Shed, or Storage Units**

- Take old paint, oils, or chemicals to hazardous waste drop-off points.
- Recycle old tools and scrap metal.
- Donate working tools, camping gear, or sports equipment.
- Rehome mobility aids or medical items to reuse programs.
- Drop off timber at timber recycling centres (if in usable condition).

#### Tips:

Tools or machinery often hold value — consider reselling or donating to Men's Sheds.

#### **Garden and Outdoor Areas**

- Return plastic pots and seedling trays to Bunnings for recycling.
- Gift or donate healthy plants to neighbours or community gardens.
- Offer plants and garden items for free or sale online.
- Donate garden tools to Men's Sheds or repair cafés.
- Recycle broken metal garden furniture at a scrap metal yard.

Donate decorative items like pots or ornaments to op shops.

#### Tips:

Use social media groups like Buy Nothing or local gardening pages for quick rehoming.

Use Gumtree to connect with metal scrap recyclers
